Lords Spiritual: Parliamentary Spokespeople

The Lords Spiritual agreed some while ago that they would each adopt two or three specific policy areas on which to focus their work in Parliament. The result of that agreement is in the attached list, which has now been circulated within the House of Lords. This is not an adoption of a formal 'front bench spokesman' model, such as those used by the political parties: bishops will continue to make parliamentary contributions across the range of issues. The intention is rather that the new model will enable the Lords Spiritual better to match their collective approach to the legislative demands of the Upper House and will make the task of liaising with parliamentary colleagues more straightforward.
