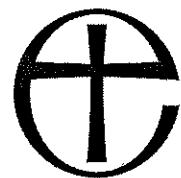

Financial Overview 2003

1. In November 2000 Synod received a report (GS Misc 627) and presentation by the Council's Financial Secretary entitled 'Forthcoming Financial Issues' which provided an overview of the financial issues facing the Church at that time.
2. That was followed in November 2002 by a report from the Financial Issues Working Group (GS 1467) setting out specific proposals relating to Clergy Stipends, Pensions and use of national resources to support the ministry of the Church. The recommendations in that report, as amended and approved by Synod, are now being taken forward.
3. The Church Commissioners' fund remains an integral and important part of the overall financial picture and they are obliged, as trustees of their fund, to make periodic reviews of their spending plans in the light of the money available to spend, working with the Archbishops' Council in the way laid down in the National Institutions Measure 1998. Current plans are fixed until the end of 2004 and the Commissioners and the Council are now working together on the next three year plan (2005-2007). They will take into account the triennial actuarial review of the Commissioners' fund due early next year, which will guide the Commissioners in their decision on how much money can be made available.
4. The Commissioners and the Council have agreed that the spending review should, on this occasion, take the form of a wide ranging strategic review of the role that all the Commissioners' non-pensions expenditure plays in supporting the ministry and mission of the Church. A separate report on this review (GS 1517) follows on the Synod agenda.
5. A financial presentation has been prepared to set the scene for Synod's consideration of that report, to provide an overview of the income and expenditure of the Church of England in 2001 (the latest figures available), to provide details of some of the key levers affecting Church finance and to demonstrate the role of the Commissioners' expenditure within that overall picture.
6. The annexes to this report provide the following information in support of the presentation:
 - (a) Church Income and Expenditure
This provides an overview of overall Church income and expenditure for the years 1993 (as shown in *First to the Lord*) and 2001. The figures should be taken as indicative as accounting practices and conventions do vary and accounting standards have changed over the period.
 - (b) Selective Stipend Allocations 2003
This sets out how selective stipend support provided by the Commissioners through the Archbishops' Council is distributed between dioceses on the basis of the new formula (Darlow) approved by the General Synod in 2001. Estimates of the total stipend bill in each diocese (excluding pension contributions and housing) are given to show the current level of dependency on national support to meet that element of diocesan expenditure.
 - (c) Commissioners' Support in 2003
This provides details of the Commissioners' total support for parish ministry,

bishops and cathedrals on a per 1,000 people (civil population) basis in order to show all dioceses on an equal ('cure of souls') footing irrespective of their Church membership and geographical size.

(d) Diocesan Resources per Stipendiary Minister

The distribution of selective stipend support (via the new 'Darlow' formula) is based on financial need as measured by 'diocesan resources per stipendiary minister'. This effectively shows the resources available in each diocese per minister. The calculation is based on three elements :-

- (i) Expected giving income based on all Church members contributing at the national average level (currently 2.8% of average personal income).
- (ii) Diocesan Investment Income
- (iii) Parochial Investment Income (unrestricted)

This schedule sets out the key elements of that calculation and the relative resources of each diocese.

(e) Giving and Parish share per Church Member 2001

This compares, by diocese, giving levels per adult church member as a % of average personal incomes and parish share per adult church member requested in 2001.

(f) Church Membership

This shows trends in church membership over the period 1990-2001. Church membership is based on 1/3rd Electoral roll plus 2/3rds Sunday attendance (usual Sunday attendance up to 1999 and average Sunday attendance thereafter).

(g) Church Commissioners' support for the Church 1990-2004

This shows the spending by the Commissioners during the 1990s and up to the end of their current three year spending plan. The reductions in spending on parish ministry support reflect the Commissioners' adoption of a sustainable spending strategy which is intended to deliver a consistent amount of financial support to the Church, unchanged in real terms (except for their pensions payments which gradually decline), into the long term future.

(h) Church Commissioners' spending plan for 2002-04

This shows in more detail the spending plan which the Commissioners adopted for 2002-04.

Selective allocations for stipends and housing

- Actual allocations by diocese for 2003

Non-selective support for stipends

- Actual split of additional allocations by diocese for 2003
- Guaranteed annuities, priest-in-charge grants, team vicar grants, PG paid as GA, personal grants. Actual figure by diocese for December 2002 grossed up for year.
- Curacy funds, actual figures for 2003
- National insurance class 1a and senior clergy returning grants - budgets for 2003 apportioned by Sheffield share for 2003

Parish Mission Funding

- Agreed amounts to be distributed to dioceses in 2003

Other Parish Ministry Support
