

Returns of membership and finance for the year 1978 were collected from the parishes in all dioceses, and estimates based on a sample of those returns were published in the Statistical Supplement to the 1980 Year Book. Full statistics evaluated from the returns were sent to the dioceses in 1980, and they are summarised in this Supplement, in which some comparisons are made with estimates based on a sample of returns for 1979. A full collection of returns will be made for the year 1980.

Clergy

At the General Synod November 1980 sessions the Synod took note of a report by the Ministry Co-ordinating Group (GS 459) "The Church's Ministry—A Survey, November 1980". In Annex III of GS 459 Table 1 gave a statistical progress report on the implementation of the "Sheffield" deployment formula, and Table 2 showed the distribution of the projected members of full-time diocesan clergymen up to 1986. In this Supplement to the Year Book Table 1 includes information extracted from GS 459, and other tables show clergy age structures, inter-diocesan movements, movements to and from non-diocesan posts, retirements and deaths. At mid 1980 90.2 per cent of clergymen were under 65 years of age compared with 89.8 per cent in 1979, and retirements at 65 years continue at a high level. In 1979 417 deacons were ordained including 114 for the non-stipendiary ministry compared with 391 (82 non-stipendiary) in 1978.

Membership

In the Statistical Supplement to the 1980 Year Book, reference was made to increased membership figures in 1978 compared with 1976. The upward trend continued in 1979 in all but confirmations. In that year, compared with 1976, baptisms increased by 7.7 per cent, Easter communicants by 2.0 per cent, Christmas communicants by 10.5 per cent, Sunday communicants by 8.1 per cent, Sunday attendances by 0.5 per cent and planned giving subscribers by 5.1 per cent. 1978 produced the highest number of confirmation candidates since 1973 and, although there was a marginal decrease in 1979, the numbers in the years 1974–1977 were exceeded. Increases in 1979 compared with 1978 can be seen in Table 15 on page 20.

Finance

The rate of inflation in 1979, as measured from the Retail Price Index, was 13.4 per cent. As stated in "A Giving Church?", in 1979 direct giving in the parishes rose by nearly five per cent in real terms compared with 1978. Between 1976 and 1978, when the overall rate of inflation was 25.5 per cent, there was also a modest increase in real terms in parish incomes. Before 1976, according to information available to the Statistical Department, there had been no increases in real terms in parish incomes, with the exception of covenants, since 1964. Average weekly contributions per electoral roll member to direct giving and all voluntary income in 1979 were 46½p and 67p respectively compared with 39½p and 57p in 1978 and 27p and 39p in 1976.

Income

Total planned giving	= net covenants and uncovenanted planned giving.
Total direct giving	= planned giving plus church collections and boxes.
Total voluntary income	= direct giving, plus income tax on covenants, net proceeds from gift days, fetes and bazaars, net profit from magazines and bookstalls, sundry donations.
Total ordinary income	= voluntary income plus fees, dividends and interest, net surplus on church halls and property, trust income, grants.
Extraordinary income	= donations and appeals for special capital purposes, non-recurring grants, legacies and bequests, insurance claims, loans and transfers from reserves.
Expenditure	
Ministry and diocese	= payments towards clergy and layworkers' stipends, housing, and working expenses; diocesan quota/share and other diocesan payments.
Church and services	= heating, lighting, cleaning, insurance, minor repairs; upkeep of services, books, music, robes; churchyard; salaries and wages.
Other ordinary parish expenditure	= net deficiency on church halls and property; church day and Sunday schools; Christian stewardship; sick and poor; net loss on magazines and bookstalls; administration, printing, stationery, postage, sundries.
Payments outside the parish	= overseas missions, home missions, other church societies and organisations, secular charities.
Extraordinary expenditure	= new buildings and major repairs—church and installations, church halls, clergy houses; initial cost of a Christian stewardship campaign; repayment of loans; transfers to reserves.






DIAGRAM III—Income

Provinces of Canterbury and York




Notes. 1. Maintained primary and secondary schools are of two kinds, those established by Local Education Authorities called *County Schools* and those established by voluntary bodies, mainly the religious denominations, called *Voluntary Schools*.

2. A department is a portion of a school which normally has a separate head teacher.

3. Primary schools—consist mainly of infants' schools for children aged 5 to 7, junior schools for those aged 7 to 11 and senior and infant schools for both age groups. In addition, first schools cater for ages from 5 to 8, 9 or 10. They are the first stage of a three tier system.

Middle schools—take children from first schools. They cater for older junior and younger senior pupils. The age ranges of these schools are 8 to 12, 9 to 12, 9 to 13, 10 to 13 and 10 to 14. Those for pupils aged 8 to 12 and 9 to 12 are deemed primary, those for ages 10 to 13 and 10 to 14 are deemed secondary, and those for ages 9 to 13 may be deemed either primary or secondary according to the choice of the Local Education Authority. Pupils from these schools generally go on to comprehensive upper schools.

Secondary schools—Secondary education is provided mainly in three types of school—secondary modern, secondary grammar and comprehensive. A school is classified as comprehensive when its admission arrangements are without reference to ability and aptitude. There is a small and decreasing number of technical schools. Schools which do not fall into these four categories are classified as other secondary schools.

4. In the above table Middle schools deemed primary are included with Primary schools, and Middle schools deemed secondary are included with secondary schools.
