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General

This edition of 'Church Statistics' is slightly larger than usual, and contains a number of new features. Diocesan population and general statistics have been given in descending order of magnitude, so that it is easy to pick out, for example, the largest in area (York) or the one with the most churches (Oxford). There are new sections on Church schools and the Church Army. Membership figures, previously confined to two tables, have been increased to four. Figures for Religious Communities and Licensed Readers have been expanded.

As usual, the booklet contains the latest available statistics extracted from the Returns of Church Membership and Finance. These are sent annually to each of the 13,000 parishes of the Church of England. The identification, validation and processing of these Returns, and the production of statistics which will, as far as possible, reflect the actual position within each diocese, is a major part of the work of the Central Board's Statistics Department. As always, the success of this undertaking is substantially due to the assistance of staff in diocesan offices (some of whom do our initial processing for us) and to the time and effort given by those in the parishes who complete the Returns. We are very grateful to them.

The last edition of 'Church Statistics' was published in December 1989. It is our hope that a recent restructuring of the Statistics Department will enable the Board to revert to the pre-1986 practice of publishing annually.

The clergy

"How many clergy has the Church of England got?" This is a more difficult question to answer than might be expected, because of the Church's decentralised nature and the incomplete information that we have about clergy who do not hold full-time paid appointments, or who have moved outside diocesan structures. In respect of those clergymen and women working in the cathedrals, the parishes or diocesan-funded posts and paid by the Church Commissioners, the statistics are accurate, regularly provided and comparable over several years. For 1989 and 1990, the figures of such clergy are continuations of previous trends. The slight decline in the number of men (down from 10,608 in 1988 to 10,480 in 1990, a fall of one per cent) has largely been balanced by an increase in the number of women (up in the same period from 503 to 596, a rise of over 18 per cent).

Although the above figures account for the majority of active clergymen and women, there are many clergy serving parishes and institutions throughout England who cannot be quantified with any certainty, but who are nevertheless a vital part of the Church's total ordained ministry. Some of these, perhaps 1,500, are clergy working in 'sector ministries' as hospital, Forces, prison, industrial and school and college chaplains. There are over 1,000 non-stipendiary clergy holding

a bishop's licence. Some 6,000 retired clergy hold a licence to officiate; many of these will take or assist in Sunday services, and in some cases have a parish in their care. Thus, important as they are, the clergy figures quoted in the following Tables show an incomplete picture.

After a low point in 1989, recommendations for training for the ordained stipendiary ministry increased in 1990, and are likely to increase further in 1991.

Membership

A great deal of interest always centres on membership figures. It is, of course, impossible to produce any single figure, however well researched, which gives a wholly satisfactory answer to the question "How many members has the Church of England?". In its widest sense it usually means a person baptised in the Church. The last such figure to be published, in 1979, was some 27 million. Nowadays, it is not possible to produce such a figure with any reliability, nor would it be of help in determining the number of those actually committed to supporting the Church and attending its services. It is necessary rather to look at a number of facets of Church life to provide us with a guide. These include numbers on electoral rolls, usual Sunday attendance figures, numbers of Easter and Christmas communicants etc. Note should also be taken of numbers of marriages and infant baptism rates.

The most obvious guide is to take the number of regular church-going members as measured by the statistics relating to Sunday communicants and attendances. The former have generally increased in line with the '15 plus' population. Since 1986, when separate figures for adult and child attendances were first collected, attendances among the under-16 age group have decreased by 7 per cent. Adult attendances have held steady; 914,000 in 1986, 920,000 in 1989.

Figures for confirmations, electoral rolls and Easter and Christmas Communicants likewise give an indication of membership of various degrees of commitment. Of the latest figures, all but electoral rolls have shown a decrease over the previous year, and all have declined over the past decade. However, the decline has not been uniform. The steepest has been in confirmations, down in total by 39 per cent over the decade. Most of this decrease has been in younger people, although this will be due partly to overall population decreases in these age groups. Electoral roll figures have increased since 1984, but this is probably due to the 6-year cyclic nature of electoral roll membership; new rolls were prepared in 1990, and the figures are expected to show a significant reduction over those of 1989.

Whatever the popularity of marriage as an institution, the proportion of Anglican marriages in England and Wales has, as Table 40 shows, remained remarkably steady over the past decade. Over the period 1978-1989, infant baptisms have fallen from 38 per cent of live births to 29 per cent. Although this indicates a reduction in nominal membership, it should be remembered that infant baptism is itself a contentious issue in the Church, and that many clergy feel unable to

baptise a child without searching enquiry into the faith and intentions of parents and godparents. (Baptisms of those aged 13 and over have remained steady at around 10,000 since the figures were first collected in 1986).

Finance

The statistics for parochial income, particularly from the giving of church people, have continued to increase above the rate of inflation. However, the down-turn in the economy during 1989 seems to have had an effect; such increases have generally been smaller than in previous years. Direct giving, increasing at around 5 per cent per year above the Retail Price Index in the mid 1980's, rose by half that amount between 1988 and 1989. Although giving now, in real terms, is higher than it was thirty years ago (when there was a considerably larger membership base), the figures are nevertheless cause for some concern. They have clearly not kept up with wage inflation, and levels of per capita giving are still distinctly modest.

Definitions

In the tables relating to parish finance, components of income and expenditure are defined as follows :

Income

Total planned giving	= net covenants including regular Gift Aid donations and uncovenanted planned giving.
Total direct giving	= planned giving plus church collections and boxes.
Other voluntary income	= all other voluntary income for ordinary expenditure excluding direct giving and income tax on covenants e.g. fund-raising events, net profit on magazine/bookstall, sundry donations.
Total voluntary income	= direct giving plus income tax on covenants plus other voluntary income.
Other ordinary income	= dividends and interest, recurring diocesan and other grants, and all other income for expenditure on ordinary purposes of the PCC. For example, fees paid to the PCC, net surplus from church hall or other buildings, income from endowments or trust funds if used for ordinary purposes.
Total ordinary income	= total voluntary income plus ordinary income.

Expenditure

The Church Overseas	= payments to (a) the recognised missionary societies, other overseas missions, diocesan associations and Diocesan Mission Councils. (b) Christian organisations primarily concerned with relief and development.
Home Missions	= payments to home missions and other Church societies and organisations.
Other Charities	= payments to other charities which are secularly based.
Total ordinary expenditure	= the total of ALL expenditure for the ordinary purposes of the PCC i.e. excluding non-recurring items of capital expenditure and non-revenue items.

The term "church member" when related to giving (Tables 33 and 34) is defined as : two-thirds (adult usual Sunday attendances) plus one-third (electoral roll membership).

Please also note that:

- Many figures in this booklet have been rounded, and that in general totals, percentages and averages were calculated before rounding. Hence row and column totals will not always agree exactly with the sum of the stated amounts.
- Among the 13,000 parishes of the Church of England there is a small number (around 300) of Local Ecumenical Projects in which there is a congregation and a ministry shared between the Church of England and certain other denominations. In such circumstances it is not always possible (or indeed desirable) to isolate the Anglican component of the congregation. The parochial membership figures will therefore include a small element which may appear also in the statistics of other Churches.

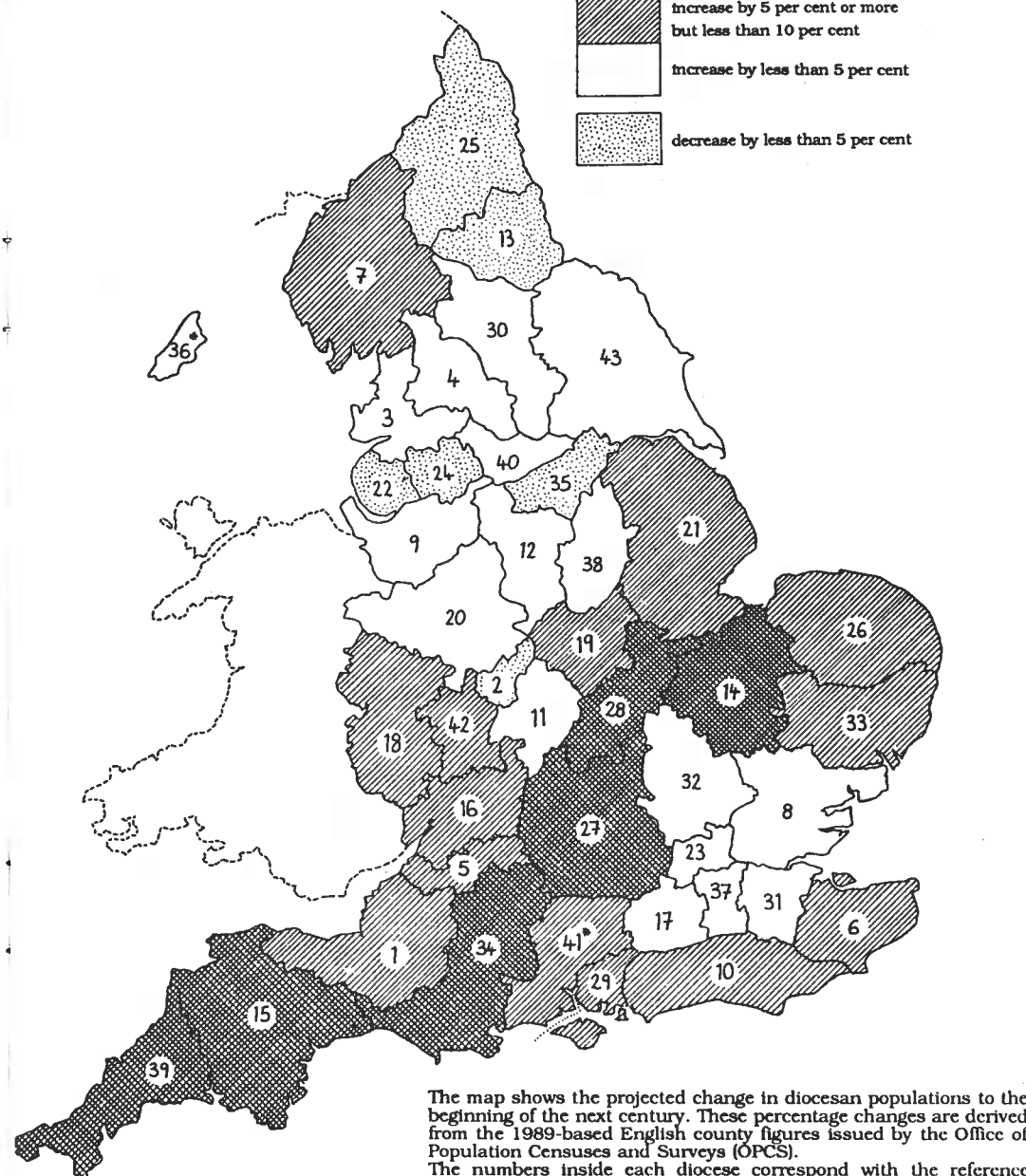
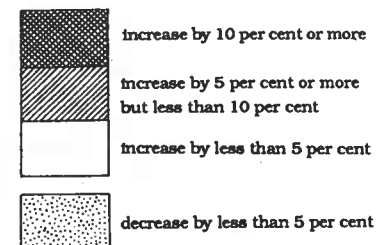

THE CLERGY

Although various statistics relating to clergyman in the Church of England have been published for many years, their present value is limited by the lack of comparability, which itself arises from the way the various categories of clergy are defined. It is only in the last 14 years that, as a result of central payment of clergy stipends by the Church Commissioners and of the requirements of the Sheffield deployment formula (see page 16) a standard definition has been adopted. This includes all those full-time stipendiary clergymen working within the diocesan structure. Thus the figures in Table 3 below are not comparable with the later ones shown in Table 4, mainly because the 'non-parochial' category in the first table includes a large number of clergy working in hospital, prison, educational and other sector ministries outside the diocesan structure.

DEPLOYMENT OF THE CLERGY

Male clergy : the 'Sheffield' formula

The 'Sheffield' formula for the deployment of the clergy was devised by a Working Group appointed by the House of Bishops and under the chairmanship of the then Bishop of Sheffield. It was first published in the Group's report in May 1974 (GS 205). The House considered the report and in January 1975 carried motions which accepted the broad principles on which the report was based and the formula which it proposed should be used to calculate each diocese's share of the available ordained manpower. The intention was to enable the Church, over a period of years, to use the manpower that was available in the most effective way possible, and in a manner which would ensure fairer shares as between dioceses than the existing distribution, based on historical patterns rather than present needs, provided. The formula has since been reviewed — see 'The Church's Ministry — A Survey' (GS 459, November 1980) and 'The Deployment of the Stipendiary Clergy' (GS 511, December 1981). One minor modification was made in 1988 to the membership factor (see below).

The formula apportions the total number of full-time, stipendiary clergy available to the 43 dioceses (Europe, because of the special nature of its chaplaincies, is not included) on the basis of four factors, weighted as shown:

- Diocesan population (8) to reflect the number of persons for whom a pastoral responsibility is assumed;
- Diocesan area (1) to reflect the larger distances to be covered in rural dioceses;
- Membership (3) to reflect the number of Church members to be cared for. Prior to 1988 this was measured solely by Electoral Roll numbers; for 1988 and later years it has been measured by:
one-third (Electoral Roll members) plus two-thirds (usual Sunday attendances, all ages).
- Number of churches (3) to reflect the number of services in different churches that need to be provided.

Shares under the formula are published each year from figures supplied by the Church Commissioners. The latest available statistics are always used.

Additionally, projections of future clergy numbers, and each diocese's share, are prepared from time to time. These are based on known trends in retirements, resignations and deaths in service, together with assumptions on the future level of ordinands and others entering the diocesan framework.

The shares yielded by the 'Sheffield' formula are therefore targets towards which dioceses should work. It should however be emphasised that the targets are moving ones; they depend not only on the total number of men available (or, in the case of projections, the validity of the trends and assumptions) but also on the relative changes in dioceses' populations and other relevant statistics.

Female clergy

A formula to allocate full-time stipendiary women deacons and deaconesses among the dioceses was approved by the House of Bishops in 1988. It is based half on historic and half on 'Sheffield-type' considerations. The historic component is based on the number of such women working in each diocese over a period of up to six years (at present, comparable figures are available for only four years). The other component consists of the four 'Sheffield' Factors, with the same weights as for the male clergy.

As with the men, shares under the formula are published each year from figures supplied by the Church Commissioners. The latest available statistics are used. At present, trends in entries to and exits from this ministry are not sufficiently well-established to allow for other than tentative projections of future numbers.

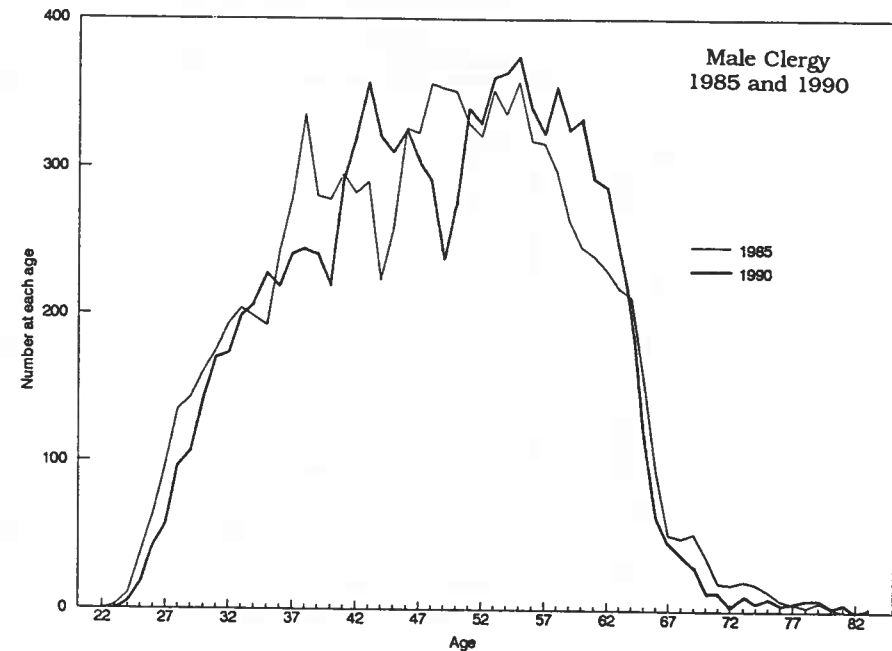

AGE PROFILES OF THE CLERGY

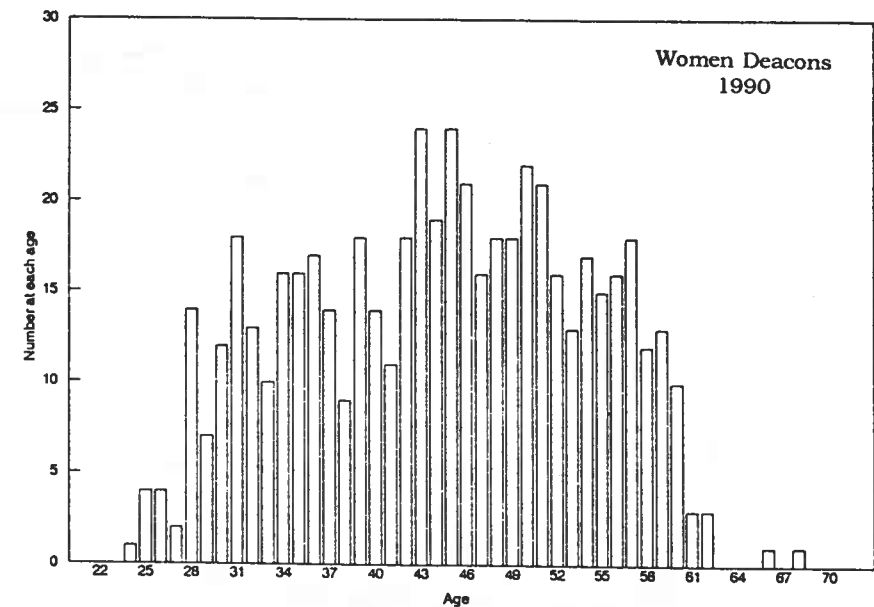
Numbers of full-time stipendiary clergy at each age on 31st December
