The 2014 report has been widely disseminated. The follow-up analysis is contributing to both the Resourcing Ministerial Education debates and developing ministry development practices in dioceses.





The Clergy Experiences of Ministry Project

The Experiences of Ministry Project is a five-year process of research and consultation that aims to build and share knowledge on what best supports and sustains the flourishing of priestly ministry. Central to this project is the recognition that ministry may encompass a diverse range of tasks, identities and settings, both between different groups of clergy and also across an individual role, and that these tasks, identities and settings are likely to further change across a life spent engaged in ministry.

This project seeks to inform national strategies for supporting ministry and shape the future emphasis of continuing ministerial education and development by asking clergy to share their personal experiences and views.
