Common Worship

The 'main volume' is the backbone of the Common Worship series – the primary worship and service book for the Church of England.

It contains material used on Sundays by most churches: a variety of Communion services and non-eucharistic forms of worship, as well as the basic Baptism service and the Psalms.

Daily Prayer

Daily Prayer

Daily Prayer is the first daily prayer book in the Church of England's history. It contains a Daily Office - a collection of orders of service designed to be prayed at different points through the day.

As well as the more traditional services of Morning, Evening and Night Prayer, Daily Prayer also offers Prayer During the Day, especially designed for those new to regular liturgical prayer. Each service contains the three key elements of praise, intercession and engagement with Scripture.

Prayers are included for both Ordinary Time and the seasons of the Christian year.

Time to Pray

Time to Pray contains a simplified 'Daily Office': a pattern of prayer, praise and daily Bible reading that is simple, fresh and accessible. It offers two flexible services, ideal for those seeking a simpler form of daily prayer or those just beginning a regular routine of time with God.

While being straightforward and flexible to use, Time to Pray draws us into a tradition that has been practised by Christians throughout the centuries and continues to be shared across the world today.

[Additional Eucharistic Prayers](#)

The increased participation of children in celebrations of the Eucharist and the growing practice of admitting children to communion have been notable features of the life of the Church of England in recent years. These additional Eucharistic prayers for Common Worship are designed for use where significant numbers of children are present, particularly in school worship.

[Christian Initiation](#)

This desk-size volume contains the liturgy for all kinds of Christian Initiation. It includes the well-known rites of Baptism and Confirmation, as well as a range of associated services to help Christians in the various stages of their journey of faith.

These associated services included Rites on the Way, designed to be used with adults who have recently found faith. These rites mark their coming to faith and help them on the journey towards baptism and confirmation. Also included are various Rites of Affirmation, designed for those who wish to mark or reaffirm a Baptism that has already taken place.

[Lectionaries and Collects](#)

The Lectionary

A lectionary is a list of Bible readings assigned to each day of the Christian year. The Common Worship Lectionary is the Bible reading plan for the Church of England, dictating which readings are read during services.

The Common Worship Lectionary consists of two main parts - the Sunday readings, which operate on a three-year cycle, and the Weekday readings, which operate on a two-year cycle. There are also special readings for feasts and festivals, many of which fall on different days each year (such as Easter). These 'moveable feasts' alter the usual pattern of readings, meaning that no year has the exact same lectionary readings as any other.

For this reason, each year the recommended Bible readings (references only) are published in a booklet to enable churches to find the correct daily readings with ease. The dates of feasts and festivals are also worked out and clearly presented.

The lectionary follows the church year, beginning on the first Sunday of Advent. This falls in late November or early December. Each annual lectionary is published in the April before it begins.

Collects

A Collect is a 'collecting prayer', one that gathers together the prayers of the congregation. It may be said at various points during a service. In the Church of England a Collect may also be used as the 'prayer of the week', prayed daily to link one's personal prayers to the Sunday liturgy.

Although a selection of Collects were included in the main volume in 2000, further Collects in contemporary language were requested and subsequently published as the Additional Collects in 2004.

For each season, it offers a wide range of prayers and blessings, as well as fully worked out services and creative outlines for key events, such as Christingle and crib services, Easter Vigils and Dawn Services.

It also includes a collection of resources for the festivals and seasons of the agricultural year and material to explore themes such as creation and the environment.

Each season's material is clearly labelled, making Times and Seasons a comprehensive bank of resources to be drawn from throughout the year.

Proclaiming the Passion

The accounts of Jesus' Passion are at the heart of the Gospel tradition. This booklet sets out the texts of the Passion narratives for dramatic reading by a number of voices, on Palm Sunday and Good Friday. This liturgical custom has been present in northern Europe since the tenth century and in recent decades has seen something of a revival.
