If there are two Scripture readings, the first may be read here, or both may be read after the canticle.


Genesis 44.1-17

Then he commanded the steward of his house, âDDFill the menâDDs sacks with food, as much as they can carry, and put each manâDDs money in the top of his sack. Put my cup, the silver cup, in the top of the sack of the youngest, with his money for the grain.âDD And he did as Joseph told him. As soon as the morning was light, the men were sent away with their donkeys. When they had gone only a short distance from the city, Joseph said to his steward, âDDGo, follow after the men; and when you overtake them, say to them, âDDWhy have you returned evil for good? Why have you stolen my silver cup? Is it not from this that my lord drinks? Does he not indeed use it for divination? You have done wrong in doing this.âDDD

When he overtook them, he repeated these words to them. They said to him, âDDWhy does my lord speak such words as these? Far be it from your servants that they should do such a thing! Look, the money that we found at the top of our sacks, we brought back to you from the land of Canaan; why then would we steal silver or gold from your lordâDDs house? Should it be found with any one of your servants, let him die; moreover, the rest of us will become my lordâDDs slaves.âDD He said, âDDEven so; in accordance with your words, let it be: he with whom it is found shall become my slave, but the rest of you shall go free.âDD Then each one quickly lowered his sack to the ground, and each opened his sack. He searched, beginning with the eldest and ending with the youngest; and the cup was found in BenjaminâDDs sack. At this they tore their clothes. Then each one loaded his donkey, and they returned to the city.

Judah and his brothers came to Josephâlls house while he was still there; and they fell to the ground before him. Joseph said to them, âllwhat deed is this that you have done? Do you not know that one such as I can practise divination?âll And Judah said, âllwhat can we say to my lord? What can we speak? How can we clear ourselves? God has found out the guilt of your servants; here we are then, my lordâlls slaves, both we and also the one in whose possession the cup has been found.âll But he said, âllFar be it from me that I should do so! Only the one in whose possession the cup was found shall be my slave; but as for you, go up in peace to your father.âll

Scripture Reading

One or more readings appointed for the day are read.

Hebrews 2.1-9

Therefore we must pay greater attention to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away from it. For if the message declared through angels was valid, and every transgression or disobedience received a just penalty, how can we escape if we neglect so great a salvation? It was declared at first through the Lord, and it was attested to us by those who heard him, while God added his testimony by signs and wonders and various miracles, and by gifts of the Holy Spirit, distributed according to his will.

Now God did not subject the coming world, about which we are speaking, to angels. But someone has testified somewhere,

âuuWhat are human beings that you are mindful of them,

Â Â or mortals, that you care for them?

You have made them for a little while lower than the angels;

Â Â you have crowned them with glory and honour,

Â subjecting all things under their feet.â□□

Now in subjecting all things to them, God left nothing outside their control. As it is, we do not yet see everything in subjection to them, but we do see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honour because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.
