Judges 9.1-21

Now Abimelech son of Jerubbaal went to Shechem to his motherâlls kinsfolk and said to them and to the whole clan of his motherâlls family, âllsay in the hearing of the lords of Shechem, âllswhich is better for you, that all seventy of the sons of Jerubbaal rule over you, or that one rule over you?âll Remember also that I am your bone and your flesh.âll So his motherâlls kinsfolk spoke all these words on his behalf in the hearing of all the lords of Shechem; and their hearts inclined to follow Abimelech, for they said, âllhe is our brother.âll They gave him seventy pieces of silver out of the temple of Baal-berith with which Abimelech hired worthless and reckless fellows, who followed him. He went to his fatherâlls house at Ophrah, and killed his brothers the sons of Jerubbaal, seventy men, on one stone; but Jotham, the youngest son of Jerubbaal, survived, for he hid himself. Then all the lords of Shechem and all Beth-millo came together, and they went and made Abimelech king, by the oak of the pillar at Shechem.

When it was told to Jotham, he went and stood on the top of Mount Gerizim, and cried aloud and said to them, âDDListen to me, you lords of Shechem, so that God may listen to you.

âDNow therefore, if you acted in good faith and honour when you made Abimelech king, and if you have dealt well with Jerubbaal and his house, and have done to him as his actions deservedâDDfor my father fought for you, and risked his life, and rescued you from the hand of Midian; but you have risen up against my fatherâDDs house this day, and have killed his sons, seventy men on one stone, and have made Abimelech, the son of his slave-woman, king over the lords of Shechem, because he is your kinsmanâDDif, I say, you have acted in good faith and honour towards Jerubbaal and towards his house this day, then rejoice in Abimelech, and let him also rejoice in you; but if not, let fire come out from Abimelech, and devour the lords of Shechem, and Beth-millo; and let fire come out from the lords of Shechem, and from Beth-millo, and devour Abimelech.âDD Then Jotham ran away and fled, going to Beer, where he remained for fear of his brother Abimelech.

Luke 15.11-end

Then Jesus said, âDDThere was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, âDDFather, give me the share of the property that will belong to me.âDD So he divided his property between them. A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and travelled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself he said, âDDHow many of my fatherâDDs hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, âDDFather, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands.âDDD So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. Then the son said to him, âDDFather, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.âDD But the father said to his slaves, âDDQuickly, bring out a robeâDDthe best oneâDDand put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals his feet. And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!âDD And they began to celebrate.

âDDNow his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. He replied, âDDYour brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.âDD Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. But he answered his father, âDDListen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!âDD Then the father said to him, âDDSon, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.âDDDD
