

A prayer video for next month's Safeguarding Sunday (November 20) has been released today and includes a contribution from the Bishop of Bristol, Viv Faull, one of the Church of England's deputy lead safeguarding bishops.

Safeguarding Sunday is an annual awareness-raising campaign coordinated by the charity Thirtyone:eight to give churches an opportunity to show their communities that they take their safeguarding responsibility seriously and to explore together as a church what safer places look like. The theme of the campaign this year is: "One Church, One Day, One message: Protecting Vulnerable People. Together."

The Bishop of Birkenhead, Julie Conalty, also a deputy lead safeguarding bishop, has filmed a video reflection for Safeguarding Sunday which will be released nearer to November 20.
