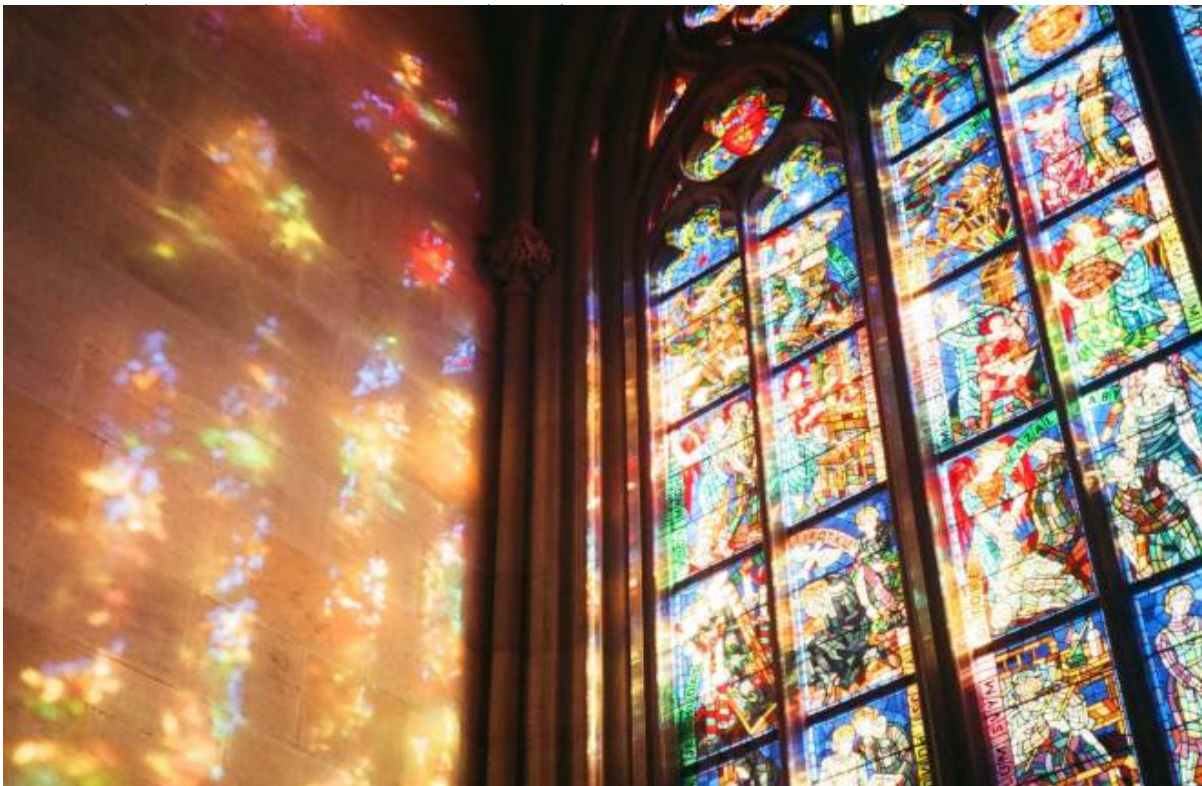
The Church of England is providing a range of resources to help churches and parishes to mark this historic moment in the life of our nation.
