- 4 One generation shall praise your works to another \square and declare your mighty acts.
- 5 They shall speak of the majesty of your glory, \square and I will tell of all your wonderful deeds.
- 6 They shall speak of the might of your marvellous acts, \square and I will also tell of your greatness.
- 7 They shall pour forth the story of your abundant kindness \square and joyfully sing of your righteousness.
- 8 The Lord is gracious and merciful, \square long-suffering and of great goodness. R
- 9 The Lord is loving to everyone \square and his mercy is over all his creatures.
- 10 All your works praise you, O Lord, □ and your faithful servants bless you.

If there are two Scripture readings, the first may be read here, or both may be read after the canticle.

1 Samuel 9.1-14

There was a man of Benjamin whose name was Kish son of Abiel son of Zeror son of Becorath son of Aphiah, a Benjaminite, a man of wealth. He had a son whose

name was Saul, a handsome young man. There was not a man among the people of Israel more handsome than he; he stood head and shoulders above everyone

else.

Now the donkeys of Kish, Saul's father, had strayed. So Kish said to his son Saul, 'Take one of the boys with you; go and look for the donkeys.' He passed through

the hill country of Ephraim and passed through the land of Shalishah, but they did not find them. And they passed through the land of Shaalim, but they were not

there. Then he passed through the land of Benjamin, but they did not find them.

When they came to the land of Zuph, Saul said to the boy who was with him, 'Let us turn back, or my father will stop worrying about the donkeys and worry about

us.' But he said to him, 'There is a man of God in this town; he is a man held in honour. Whatever he says always comes true. Let us go there now; perhaps he will

tell us about the journey on which we have set out.' Then Saul replied to the boy, 'But if we go, what can we bring the man? For the bread in our sacks is gone, and

there is no present to bring to the man of God. What have we?' The boy answered Saul again, 'Here, I have with me a quarter-shekel of silver; I will give it to the man

of God, to tell us our way.' (Formerly in Israel, anyone who went to inquire of God would say, 'Come, let us go to the seer'; for the one who is now called a prophet

was formerly called a seer.) Saul said to the boy, 'Good; come, let us go.' So they went to the town where the man of God was.

As they went up the hill to the town, they met some girls coming out to draw water, and said to them, 'Is the seer here?' They answered, 'Yes, there he is just ahead

of you. Hurry; he has come just now to the town, because the people have a sacrifice today at the shrine. As soon as you enter the town, you will find him, before

he goes up to the shrine to eat. For the people will not eat until he comes, since he must bless the sacrifice; afterwards those eat who are invited. Now go up, for

you will meet him immediately.' So they went up to the town. As they were entering the town, they saw Samuel coming out towards them on his way up to the

shrine.

Canticle

A Song of the Justified, or another suitable canticle, for example, number 61 (page 619), may be said

Refrain:

Scripture Reading

One or more readings appointed for the day are read.

Luke 22.1-13

Now the festival of Unleavened Bread, which is called the Passover, was near. The chief priests and the scribes were looking for a way to put Jesus to death, for they were afraid of the people.

Then Satan entered into Judas called Iscariot, who was one of the twelve; he went away and conferred with the chief priests and officers of the temple police about how he might betray him to them. They were greatly pleased and agreed to give him money. So he consented and began to look for an opportunity to betray him to them when no crowd was present.

Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, 'Go and prepare the Passover meal for us that we may eat it.' They asked him, 'Where do you want us to make preparations for it?' 'Listen,' he said to them, 'when you have entered the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him into the house he enters and say to the owner of the house, "The teacher asks you, 'Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' "He will show you a large room upstairs, already furnished. Make preparations for us there.' So they went and found everything as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover meal.

AllYou have scattered the proud in their conceit, and lifted up the lowly.

1My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour; □ he has looked with favour on his lowly servant.

2From this day all generations will call me blessed; \square the Almighty has done great things for me and holy is his name.

3He has mercy on those who fear him, \square from generation to generation.

4He has shown strength with his arm \square and has scattered the proud in their conceit,

5Casting down the mighty from their thrones \square and lifting up the lowly.

6He has filled the hungry with good things $\ \square$ and sent the rich away empty.

8The promise made to our ancestors, \square to Abraham and his children for ever.

Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
