Foreword

Introduction

Church Statistics 2001 provides results from the second year of new data collection methods among Church of England parishes and cathedrals at the turn of the millennium. They must be interpreted against the background of the 2001 government census results which indicated a continuing majority of the English population to be Christian. In summary, 72% of the population of England was Christian, 6% of other faiths, 14% of no religion and 8% did not state their religion.

In a pluralistic society, Christian denominations continue to play a significant role in the life of our country. Over half of the adult population regards itself as Anglican (2001 Opinion Research Business survey). Church Statistics 2001 provides further and more detailed evidence of the continued involvement of the Church of England in the everyday lives of men, women and children at the beginning of the twenty-first century.

New attendance statistics

Following a major review of annual statistical information collection from parishes, new attendance measures were designed with dioceses during the summer of 2000. That autumn the first and perhaps most significant change was effected successfully across the majority of dioceses. Up and down the length and breadth of England, churches began to count the attendance levels at their church services throughout four weeks in October. There is no single period in the year when church attendance could be said to be 'normal' or even 'average' but October is accepted by our ecumenical partners as the easiest and most comparable month in which to carry out this quantitative exercise.

It would be wrong to make direct comparisons between the numbers found to be in our church services across October and the figures which churches report as their usual Sunday attendance. Examination of the attendance levels collated in this publication in tables 11 and 12 reveal *a larger church than was previously understood*. On

average 1.2 million people attended church based services of worship each week, 1 million of these on Sundays. Numbers fluctuated week by week, among adults on average doubling at points across the month while almost quadrupling among children and young people. Across a typical month in the year parish church and cathedral worship attracted 1.7 million people but only 1.4 million of these attended on Sundays. The Church is indeed a seven days a week Church.

Easter and Christmas are traditionally festivals in the Christian year when many attend special occasions of worship in our parish churches and cathedrals. Churches and cathedrals were asked to estimate attendance levels at these festivals for the first time in 2000. The results are challenging and in the case of cathedrals reflected steadily increasing numbers throughout the year. On Christmas Day/Eve 2001 2.6 million people attended church and cathedral worship, while 1.6 million attended on Easter Day. The growing importance of this Christian festival in people's lives is evident in that Christmas services attracted over twice the average weekly attendance of our churches and cathedrals. Allowing for other services of worship (carols, Christingles etc.) not included in this Christmas count, *the size of the church in England, if portrayed in these terms, is over 2* ³/₄ *million people which is approaching three times the figure of 1 million often cited in the public arena.*

Occasional offices

The church has traditionally monitored Electoral Roll and baptism levels, but in 2000 parishes and cathedrals were asked to estimate the number of occasions where people received direct pastoral contact through each of the occasional offices. Marriages can be performed in places other than churches and cathedrals. Tables 19 and 20 (based on local authority registrars returns) indicate that a quarter of marriages were performed by Church of England ministers. Local churches had significant opportunities for mission and ministry through over 450,000 occasional offices performed by their ministers in 2001. Funerals accounted for over half of these and many clergy find themselves unsupported in this particular ministry. Baptisms and thanksgivings represented over a third of the occasional offices, marriages and blessings of civil marriages about one in seven. At these essentially family and community events, local churches have unique opportunities for contact among a wide constituency.

Finance

The Government's 'Getting Britain Giving' arrangements for Gift Aid, Payroll giving and Share giving, announced in 2000, were aimed at increasing the number of givers and the amounts given to charities. The year 2001 was the first full year of the new arrangements and it can be seen from the results reported here on personal giving, that the benefits of the new Gift Aid arrangements are having a positive effect on levels of giving and numbers of tax-efficient givers in local churches.

The number of people giving regularly in a tax-efficient way increased by 10% in 2000 and by a further 13% in 2001. In addition, occasional worshippers and visitors have used one-off Gift Aid envelopes to increase each £1 of giving to £1.28. The tax that can be recovered increased by 7% in 2000 and by over 11% in 2001. While this is good news, there is still room for more giving to be made in a tax-efficient way.

Now that deeds of covenant can no longer be used to identify tax-efficient giving, many parishes find it helpful to use a pledge form. Church people can then promise to give a certain amount regularly to the Church's mission and ministry and the PCC can use the amounts pledged for its forward planning. Those who pay UK tax are then encouraged to support their pledge by completing a Gift Aid declaration. Those who are not able to complete a declaration for whatever reason can still be seen to be a regular contributor to the Church's work.

In 2001, parishes were asked to indicate whether they used pledge forms to assist in their forward planning. Three-quarters of responding parishes indicated that they used pledge forms while a third of those who do not use such forms agreed that it might help to encourage giving.

It is not until pledge forms are universally used that a complete picture can be given of whether the increase in giving by Gift Aid is from new contributors or from those who previously planned their giving but felt unhappy about using a deed of covenant. However, the increase in tax-efficient planned giving of almost 14% has been offset by a reduction in collections at services and other giving, which suggests that the increases are largely due to donor movement rather than new donors.

Summary

Today people support their local church (and cathedral) in many different ways. While the quantitative information is not fully comprehensive, it does provide a healthy picture of the variety of local church life. Church attendance patterns, the role of the occasional offices, the increased diversity of ordained and lay ministries, financial giving and other measures of church support are all evolving at the turn of the millennium in ways which are beginning to capture the interest of many serious church commentators.

We are particularly grateful to the dioceses and the parishes for being willing to embrace new aspects of the annual parochial return exercise. Their cooperation continues to remain crucial to the successful gathering of the information required for this publication and we are encouraged that they too are finding the results useful for their own forward planning. This edition includes as much appropriate information as possible from the Diocese in Europe and from diocesan cathedrals.

Definitions

In the tables relating to **attendance at church services** new measures of church attendance are employed:

Average Sunday attendance

= the average number of attenders at Sunday church services typically over a four week period in October.

Average weekly attendance

= the average number of attenders at church services throughout the week typically over a four week period in October.

Each of the above measures are provided separately for adults and children/ young people aged under 16 years. The highest and lowest counts over the four week period are calculated as follows:

Highest Sunday/ weekly attendance

= the sum of the highest Sunday (weekly) attendances over the four week period.

Lowest Sunday/ weekly attendance

= the sum of the lowest Sunday (weekly) attendances over the four week period.

Attendance figures have only been included where local churches held at least one church based service (which included adult presence) during the week under examination.

Definitions (continued)

In the tables relating to **finance**, components of income and expenditure are defined as follows:

Income

Tax-efficient planned = tax-efficient planned giving including regular Gift Aid donations.

Total direct giving = planned giving plus church collections and boxes.

Other voluntary income = all other voluntary income for ordinary expenditure excluding direct giving and income tax, e.g. fund-raising events, net profit on magazine/bookstall, sundry donations.

Total voluntary income = direct giving plus income tax plus other voluntary income.

Other recurring income = dividends and interest, recurring diocesan and other grants, and all other income for expenditure on ordinary purposes of the PCC, net surplus from church hall or other buildings, income from endowments or trust funds if used for ordinary purposes.

Total recurring income= total voluntary income plus other recurring income.

Expenditure

Total recurring expenditure = the total of ALL expenditure (including charitable giving) for the ordinary purposes of the PCC i.e. excluding only non-recurring items of capital expenditure and non-revenue items.

Notes

- While many figures in this booklet have been rounded, totals, percentages and averages were calculated before rounding. Hence row and column totals will not always agree exactly with the sum of the stated amounts.
- 2. Among the 13,000 parishes of the Church of England there are around 750 Local Ecumenical Projects in roughly half of which there is a congregation and a ministry shared between the Church of England and certain other churches. In such circumstances it is not always possible (or indeed desirable) to isolate the Anglican component of the congregation. The parochial statistics will therefore include a small element which may appear also in the statistics of other churches.
- 3. Figures for *cathedrals* and *the Diocese in Europe* are included as far as possible. Their inclusion is most frequently inappropriate in the finance tables.
- 4. Unrestricted income is income that may be used by the PCC for general church expenses. Restricted income is income which may not be used for any purpose other than as specified by the donor. (Income which a PCC designates for a specified purpose is considered to be unrestricted, since the PCC and not the donor is determining how it is to be used.)
- 5. **Recurring income** includes direct giving, other voluntary income and any other recurring income. **One-off income** includes non-recurring grants, legacies, special appeals, insurance claims and the sale of fixed assets.
- 6. **Recurring expenditure** includes donations to charities, parish share/quota, clergy expenses, church running costs, costs relating to trading, salaries and support costs. **Capital expenditure** includes major repairs, redecoration and new building work.



4 Comparison of licensed ministries 2001



The figures for dignitaries, parochial clergy, non-parochial diocesan and other clergy and lay workers (including Church Army evangelists) in figure 4 above and the related tables are based on statistics derived from the central Church payroll. Details of chaplains and other ministers working outside the diocesan framework, and of non-stipendiary clergy, are based on statistics derived from the database used to compile Crockford's Clerical Directory. Where possible, they have been cross-referenced with material produced by organizing bodies (e.g. the Home Office for prison chaplains, and the Hospital Chaplaincies Council for hospital chaplains).

The figure shown for active retired ordained clergy is an estimate of the number of licensed retired clergy who take an active part in ministry. It is based on the number of retired clergy known to have either permission to officiate, licence to officiate or actual appointments (4,647). Pension Board records indicate a total of 7,703 retired stipendiary clergy.





New statistics gathered on the occasional offices reveal that on average each (stipendiary) parochial cleric undertakes one occasional office every week and this is almost equally split between funerals and the remaining occasional offices.

Almost 452,000 occasional offices were taken during the year 2001 by parish and cathedral ministers. Approximately half were funerals, over a third were baptisms or services of thanksgiving while about one in seven were marriages or blessings of civil marriage.

Since 2000 there has been a 4% drop in the number of occasional offices undertaken by parish and cathedral ministers which appears to be equally spread across the different offices.

In 2001, Church of England parochial funerals were conducted for 46% of all deaths in England. In addition to parochial funerals, funerals were also conducted by Church of England clergy outside the parochial system, for example by chaplains or by retired clergy without reference to the local parish.





Over the twenty five years following 1976 the proportion of male and female confirmation candidates has not altered. In 2001 and in 1976, 61% of confirmation candidates were female and 39% were male.

The age profile of confirmation candidates has, however, become older over the same twenty five year period. In 2001 23% of confirmation candidates were under 12 years of age while in 1976 this proportion was 17%. In 2001 33% of candidates were aged 12 to 15 years and 6% were aged 16 to 19 years, while in 1976 the proportions were 55% and 8% respectively. In 2001 38% of confimation candidates were aged 20 years or over while in 1976 this proportion was 20%.












30 Unrestricted recurring income 2001



31 Total recurring expenditure 2001




32 Tax-efficient planned giving as a percentage of unrestricted recurrent income
