Follow-up

The Archbishop's Council is responding to this Motion by building on the work being carried out under the How We Work programme, which is about improving how the National Church Institutions (NCIs) serve and support the mission and ministry of the Church. A national service to better enable and support recruitment (Pathways), particularly through the provision of digital tools, was launched in August 2017. As at the end of January 2017 there were 24 subscribers to the service, 19 of whom were dioceses. This is seeking to improve the effectiveness of recruitment processes and to yield cost savings. Customer use of the service is growing steadily and customer feedback has been positive. The NCI's are consulting with the Diocesan Secretaries Liaison Group in order to identify priorities for future service provision that will support dioceses and have the potential to leverage cost savings
