

Doing Mission Together:

Cooperation in mission between Church of England parishes and other denominations in English towns

There is a growing perception that while 'institutional' ecumenism may be struggling, churches working together to transform their local community are changing the Christian landscape in this country. So how likely are Church of England parishes to be sharing in missional activities with other churches, does such cooperation tend to focus on particular aspects of mission, and what helps it to be effective? *Doing Mission Together* reports on a research project to help answer these questions conducted over a two-year period by the Council for Christian Unity.

In addition, copies of *After Brexit? European Unity and the Unity of European Churches* will be available. This newly published book is based on a colloquium held in November at Lambeth Palace and includes chapters by the Archbishop of Canterbury, Grace Davie, Piers Ludlow and Ben Ryan.



THE IMPACT OF LEGAL AID CUTS ON THE MOST VULNERABLE IN OUR COMMUNITIES

Every day, ordinary people face legal problems where they need to be able to get the right advice and support as soon as possible. Be it a parent trying to secure contact with their child, a disabled person who has had her benefits wrongly cut, or an 18-year-old born in the UK who is trying to regularise his immigration status or claim her entitlement to British citizenship. Without that advice and support the consequences can be profound: they could face being made homeless, falling deeply into debt, being prevented from seeing their children, or being separated from their families. This has a significant human cost for the individuals themselves and their families, and a wider cost to society as other services have These are some of the consequences of the severe cuts to civil legal aid that were included in the 2012 Legal Aid, Sentencing and Punishment of Offenders (LASPO) Act. The upshot of those changes is a two-tier justice system: open to those who can afford it, but, increasingly closed to the poorest, most vulnerable and most in need of its protection.

MAKING Disciples



Many of our churches are challenged when it comes to knowing how to make genuine disciples of Jesus. Over the last 5 years a fresh new approach to discipleship and spiritual formation has been developed within the local church. In our 45 min session we will explore 'Making Disciples' and show how it can be helpful not only for parishes but also Dioceses in understanding what is going on with both individual's and group's discipleship. Centring around a pioneering new assessment tool and simple language it allows leaders to see how people are doing in their spiritual formation and where there is gaps in their development.

This resource has been used in churches from a variety of traditions all over the country to rethink and awaken discipleship and formation within the church. This session will especially be helpful for those with roles focusing on larger discipleship and formation strategy.

In this session we will:

- Show the impact the assessment tool has had on churches.
- Share simple language any parish can adopt to help discipleship.
- Share actual data and research from the national church around discipleship and formation.
- Explain how this resource could be used across the country by Dioceses to awaken discipleship.
- Give ways the PCC and Synods can evaluate the impact they are making in the area of discipleship and formation.


