The Church's practice of mission can (more or less consciously) assume that a privileged "we" are called to evangelise, serve, and care for a needy "them". Yet, in Mark, it is those in greatest need who grasp the nature of the Kingdom, and exemplify the pattern of faith to which all are called. The Church cannot, therefore, be a body that is for or even with the poorest and most marginalised. In Pope Francis's words, it must be "a poor Church of the poor". The transformation that our society needs "cannot be driven from the centre, but rather must come from the peripheries, whether existential and social or political and religious" (Rafael Luciano, Pope Francis' biographer).

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

Do we know just how cruel and unbalanced new style modern charismatic churches can be? They may get the head count and the money in but I experienced first hand cruel judgemental attitudes from one such church catering mainly for fit young students. Get rid of vicars and you get rid of a lot experience, acceptance and balance that has always been at the heart of being British. The current parish system means that vicars serve the parish in a non judgemental way. One step into a new style charismatic church and their superficial judgements and assumptions about 'where you are with Jesus' are already kicking in. Theologically they readily come off the rails even with their own grace doctrines. I was actually forbidden to pray for people and they emphasised the authority of the elders. The exuberance and desire for simple power structures in the young can turn tribal and self serving, appealing only at a highly emotional level. Please please don't just get rid of vicars, they are our last stand for real acceptance and grace in this country. They may tend to have rather posh backgrounds but they can have a calmer and more balanced view in adversity and trials of life that highly emotional students don't yet have. Also vicars are supervised but too many pastors and elders are unsupervised. Scrap a system recklessly and we lose a wealth of balance and experience. I for one would feel alienated.

I've just briefly scan read the minutes. In the time honoured Western cultured way it all written up on the assumption of what defines Western success. However there is nothing I can see about giving folks the opportunity to grow, reflect or to question. Its all about bumping up numbers not about developing spiritually. Its not just about retaining vicars to think for us and bless us but about the chance to think and about spiritual education. Nothing in modern society encourages us to think, care or develop a productive live conscience, rather the opposite. Do we really want a classist society where only vicars and people with enough money to have time to think develop conscience? To get a feeling of debate and evaluation these days I find I have turn on the telly rather than go to Church. Now the majority of folks are illiterate, we have the new poverty of time and opportunity to think. The boils of doubt and uncertainty aren't lanced with periodic dollops of Sunday meetings. When the awkward issues are debated on the telly but absent in Church it becomes increasingly surreal and removed. Let's not forget that knowing you as an individual are worth something and are very special and precious is part of spiritual education. Really knowing that if you are feeling suicidal is really important when social values are so vacuous and superficial. One is not just a number. The need for spiritual education is more than clear when I see folks playing with the dark side on programmes like 'most haunted'. They have no idea there is no play with demons, they don't play, and no power as great as Christ's love.

Yet another reminder of the desperate need of spiritual education in the value of life is the number of knifings and serious level of bullying in schools and bullying in the workplace. Also the increasingly accepted racism, ageism etc. and the fact that there are elements of the bully and victim in us all.

Dear Paula,

The consultation process is designed to collect all the concerns, points raised by those who participate in it to inform the Bishop's Council when it has to decide how to proceed.

As was said at the meeting last week, it has always been the proposal to significantly increase the staffing levels in Leigh Park, Warren Park and West Leigh so that we can maintain our traditional church worship whilst also enabling new forms of worship and community engagement to hopefully be able to work alongside more people in the community.

In order to do this we need to change the church structure, 'benefices', to reduce the need for multiplication of work for our clergy i.e. go to having possibly one benefice, one PCC, one set of accounts etc. to produce (legally required) rather than doing it all three times for each church individually. But the nature of the law governing the Church of England means, that if we do this, that the 'offices' that Fr Jonathan and Karina currently hold will no longer exist as they are inextricably linked to the three existing benefices. Therefore, due to this church law, if the proposals were to go through to have one benefice, one parish and three churches to reduce the bureaucracy etc. then they would have to re-apply to the newly created 'offices' in the new 'benefice'.







Portsmouth's £9m makeover

Diocese plans large-scale reorganisation of urban parishes

Knockline Davies

A DOUBLING of the number of parishes being created over the next few years will mean the parishioners in many parts of the Diocese of Portsmouth will be moved into larger, more centrally-based units in the Church.

A total of 143 parishes of Portsmouth Diocese will be merged into 70 new, centrally-based units in the Church.

£3.1 million will be spent on what we believe independently being planned to coincide with the merger process.

Parishes in the Diocese of Portsmouth, Gloucester and the Isle of Wight have been identified as being too small and too spread out to be viable units.

Diocesan spokesman Rev Canon Christopher Fawcett said: "The Church of England has a responsibility to ensure that people are able to worship in a church that is accessible to them."

Parishes which will be merged include those which serve too few people, and those from which members and buildings are leaving the existing Church in order to be part of new projects, open



Planned from Hackney, London, and Brixton, by some of the 1000 people involved in the Church of England's 2016 Diocesan Conference in September 2016, Hackney Council will work with an average of 70 new parishes to provide a better service to the people who live in the area.

On Wednesday, the Bishop of Portsmouth, the Rt Rev Christopher Fawcett, said: "There has been much hard thinking to come up with a sensible approach to the future of the Church in the Diocese of Portsmouth. We are looking to build on the strengths of the other parts of the community to help us to move forward."
