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CHURCH STATISTICS

A wider dissemination of the information collected and assembled by the Statistics Department of the Central Board of Finance was obtained through the publication of the statistical section as a separate Supplement to the 1978 Year Book, and numerous enquiries and requests for further information subsequently followed. A larger Statistical Supplement to the 1979 Year Book has been compiled to include some of the statistics obtained from the full collection of parish returns of membership and finance for 1976, and a sample collection of the returns for 1977. It is not claimed that the tables and diagrams in this Supplement anticipate all the statistical needs of the Church, or that they cover all the demands for information which might reasonably be made, but they are basic to the more detailed information which can be obtained from the Statistics Department.

Clergy

An increase in the number of ordinations has been forecast from 1980 and this is reflected in the revision of the predicted numbers of clergymen in 1981 and 1982 in Table 1. The number of full-time diocesan clergymen at July 1978 was 11,549 compared with 11,782 at July 1977 and attention is again drawn to the age structure of existing clergymen and the pattern of retirement in Tables 3 and 4 respectively.

Membership

Reference was made in the Supplement to the 1978 Year Book to a pilot survey to be carried out in 1978 on changing patterns of worship and church-going. For this purpose standard membership forms with additional questions relating to the year 1977 were collected from a sample of parishes. The full analysis of the returns has not yet been completed but some preliminary results are included in Table 9. In 1977, when the birth rate continued to fall, infant baptisms fell by only 3 per cent compared with an average fall of 7 per cent per annum during the previous three years. The number of Easter communicants again showed little change, but Christmas communicants increased by about 8 per cent and now regularly exceed those at Easter. The number of communicants on a normal Sunday also increased by about 5 per cent, and Sunday service attendance by nearly 2 per cent. There were also more confirmations in 1977 than in 1976. Statistics of week day attendances at church are not yet available but it is interesting to note that, from a National Opinion Poll survey carried out in July 1978, the Statistics Department estimates that about 1.3 million persons aged 15 and over attend church once a week or more and 0.6 million once a fortnight.

Finance

The rate of inflation in 1977 was nearly 16 per cent. In the same year it is estimated that the ordinary income of the parishes increased by about 13 per cent. Average weekly contributions per electoral roll member to direct giving (net covenants, uncovenanted planned giving and collections) and to all voluntary income were 31p and 44p compared with 27p and 39p respectively in 1976.



Table 17—Average giving per member of the congregation




DIAGRAM IV.—ORDINARY ANNUAL INCOMES OF PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCILS, 1964-1977

Table 18—Average giving per member of the congregation




DIAGRAM III.—TOTAL VOLUNTARY INCOMES OF PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCILS, 1964-1977




DIAGRAM V.—TOTAL INCOMES OF PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCILS, 1964-1977



Evaluated from the Parish Returns of Finance for the year ended 31 December 1976




DIAGRAM VII.—PERCENTAGES OF EXPENDITURE, 1976

Evaluated from the Parish Returns of Finance for the year ended 31 December 1976







POPULATIONS

CHURCH OF ENGLAND DIOCESAN AREAS

- The ensuing tables and diagrams are produced to meet an increasing demand for up-to-date and reliable based population data which is required for planning purposes.
- At the request of the Central Board of Finance and the Church Commissioners, the Office of Population Censuses and Surveys (O.P.C.S.) as a special exercise compiled 1971 Census population figures for each of the Church of England diocesan areas.
- O.P.C.S. publishes mid-year estimates and forward projections for the populations of the local authority areas which, except in a few cases, are not co-terminous with diocesan areas. The Statistics Department converts the populations of local authority areas into those for diocesan areas, taking into account any diocesan boundary changes.

Projections

- When the first diocesan population projections were made by the Statistics Department they were calculated from O.P.C.S. projections for the standard regions only. Projections by O.P.C.S. are now extended to counties and local authority districts, and it is possible to calculate diocesan projections within finer limits.
- Projections are made by the demographic component method. This involves taking the number of people at each single age and estimating how many will survive to be one year older next year. The age structure of people entering and leaving each area is taken into account. It is therefore necessary to make assumptions on the future numbers of births, deaths and migrants.
- In the population article on page 26 of the Statistical Supplement to the 1978 Year Book, reference was made to the dramatic effect of the falling birth rate on the population projections which were made in 1964 when it was suggested that the population in England alone would grow from 44.7 to 51.5 million by 1981. According to revised figures published by O.P.C.S., it is estimated that between 1975 and 1976 the population of England and Wales fell by 15,000 and, for the first time since records began in 1837 (war years excepted) deaths exceeded births (by 5,000). Between 1976 and 1977 the population of England and Wales fell by 23,000 and deaths exceeded births by over 12,000.
- In a preliminary report by O.P.C.S. the mid-1977 based population projections show a decline in the size of the total population of England and Wales of about 180,000 over the years 1977 to 1982, but from 1982 onwards, when births should again exceed deaths, the population is projected to grow steadily to a total of about 51.5 million in 2017, about 2.5 million above the 1977 level. The rate of increase is highest over the years around 1990 when the annual births should be at a peak. Although the total population is expected to change relatively little in overall numbers over the next forty years, it is likely that there will be some quite large changes in age structures.
- Owing to a delay in the publication of O.P.C.S. projections for county and local authority districts based on the 1976 and 1977 estimates, diocesan population projections in columns 7 and 10 of Table 30 are based on the 1975 estimates.

2. A department is a portion of a school which normally has a separate head teacher.

3. Primary schools—consist mainly of infants' schools for children aged 5 to 7, junior schools for those aged 7 to 11 and senior infant schools for both age groups. In addition, first schools cater for ages from 5 to 8, 9 or 10. They are the first stage of a three-tier system.

Middle schools—take children from first schools. They cater for older junior and younger senior pupils. The age ranges of these schools are 8 to 12, 9 to 13, 10 to 13 and 10 to 14. Those for pupils aged 8 to 12 and 9 to 12 are deemed primary, those for ages 10 to 13 and 10 to 14 are deemed secondary, and those for ages 9 to 13 may be deemed either primary or secondary according to the choice of the Local Education Authority. Pupils from these schools generally go on to comprehensive upper schools.

Secondary schools—Secondary education is provided mainly in three types of school—secondary modern, secondary grammar and comprehensive. A school is classified as comprehensive when its admission arrangements are without reference to ability and aptitude. There is a small and decreasing number of technical schools. Schools which do not fall into these four categories are classified as other secondary schools.
