General

Up to now there has been an interval of at least two years between a full collection of parish returns of membership and finance and publication of the results in either the Church of England Yearbook or, since 1977, the Statistical Supplement. The increasing use of computer processing of returns is now enabling us to reduce this interval considerably. Processing of the returns for 1980, collected from the parishes in all dioceses except the newly-formed Diocese in Europe, is now at an advanced stage. Some results, based on a preliminary random sample of these returns, are included in this Supplement. The full results are expected to be ready for publication in early spring 1982. The relevant tables will be sent free of charge to readers of this Supplement on request (see page 35 for details).

Clergy

In their report to the General Synod in November 1980 (G.S. 459) the Ministry Co-ordinating Group forecast that there would be 10,830 full-time diocesan clergymen at 31st December 1981. Figures for December 1981 are not yet available, but in the period 1st July 1980—30th June 1981 the number of full-time clergymen fell by 243 from 11,235 to 10,992; these figures include a loss of 226 clergymen from the parochial ministry. In the same period losses resulting from retirement or death increased by 16 per cent compared with the previous year.

Membership

The marked decline in membership in the later nineteen-sixties and early seventies, common to many Christian denominations, appeared to level out in 1976. Since then the full collection of 1978 and a sample in 1979 have shown a modest upturn in most membership indices. The preliminary figures for 1980 tend to reinforce this picture. The total number of baptisms has increased by 5.9% since 1978 to its highest for seven years. In the same two-year period Easter communicants have increased by 3.9%, Christmas communicants by 1.1%, communicants on a 'normal' Sunday (i.e. other than a major festival or special occasion) by 3% and planned giving subscribers by 3.7%. Against this trend, the figure for usual Sunday attendances has shown a drop of 1.7%. This may not be the contradiction that it seems. The figure has always included a significant number who attend church at more than one service on a Sunday. Pastoral reorganisation over the past few years has, in concentrating resources, tended to reduce the number of services in some areas. Hence a drop in attendances does not necessarily imply a drop in the number of churchgoers. Furthermore, no church register of attendances is required to be kept, so that in general such information is impressionistic and therefore inherently less reliable than the well-documented figures for communicants and electoral roll membership.

Finance

The foreword to the 1981 Supplement drew attention to a modest increase in real terms in parish incomes between 1976 and 1978, a period in which the overall rate of inflation was 25.5%. It also noted a welcome rise of 5% (again in real terms) in direct giving between 1978 and 1979. The 1980 preliminary results indicate that, notwithstanding inflation of 33.8% over the period 1978—1980, parish incomes have risen by 5.8% in real terms. Similarly, direct giving between 1979 and 1980 rose by 3%.

Some Changes

Estimates of the total number of persons baptized in the Church of England, and of the total number of confirmed members, together with statistics derived from them, have been omitted because a satisfactory basis for calculating them no longer exists. Additionally the table of confirmations per 1000 population aged 12—20 years has been discontinued. A substantial proportion of those confirmed are outside this age range and the table would therefore no longer be informative. Annual figures for baptisms and confirmations will continue to be published.

Definitions

In the tables and graphs relating to parish finance, components of income and expenditure are defined as follows:—

Income

Total planned giving

= net covenants and uncovenanted planned giving.

Total direct giving

= planned giving plus church collections and boxes.

Total voluntary income

= direct giving, plus income tax on covenants, net proceeds from gift days, fetes and bazaars, net profit from magazines and bookstalls, sundry donations.

Total ordinary income

= voluntary income plus fees, dividends and interest, net surplus on church halls and property, trust income, grants.

Extraordinary income

= donations and appeals for special capital purposes, non-recurring grants, legacies and bequests, insurance claims, loans and transfers from reserves.

Expenditure

Ministry and diocese

= payments towards clergy and layworkers' stipends, housing, and working expenses; diocesan quota/share and other diocesan payments.

Church and services

= heating, lighting, cleaning, insurance, minor repairs; upkeep of service, books, music, robes; churchyard; salaries and wages.

Other ordinary parish expenditure

= net deficiency on church halls and property; church day and Sunday schools; Christian stewardship; sick and poor; net loss on magazines and bookstalls; administration, printing, stationery, postage, sundries.

Payments outside the parish

= overseas missions, home missions, other church societies and organisations, secular charities.

Extraordinary expenditure

= new buildings and major repairs—church and installations, church halls, clergy houses; initial cost of a Christian stewardship campaign; repayment of loans; transfers to reserves.



B: IN REAL TERMS based on 1964 levels



Provinces of Canterbury and York (excluding Europe)


