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FOREWORD

GENERAL

This is the first edition of "Church Statistics" to be published for two years. It incorporates the latest statistics available from the Central Board of Finance and a selection of those collected routinely by other central church organisations. It is hoped that in future the booklet can revert to an annual appearance.

The largest section in the booklet contains, as usual, the results of the Board's annual collection of membership and financial statistics from the parishes. Figures for 1987 are given, with in some cases comparable figures for 1986. The time-lag between collection and publication depends on a number of factors, but the scale of the exercise, involving in all some 13,000 parishes each year, means that even under the most favourable circumstances it is well over a year before the results become available.

The success of the operation in distributing, completing and collecting the parochial statistical returns is due in very large measure to the assistance of staff in diocesan offices, and the time and attention given by (frequently hard-pressed) clergy and parish treasurers. We should like to take this opportunity of thanking all who helped: their co-operation is much appreciated.

CLERGY

As a result of the ordination of women to the diaconate from 1987 onwards, figures are now given separately for clergymen and women deacons. Taken separately, the trends in the full-time stipendiary ordained ministry are distinctly different. Figures for the men continue to decline gently: 10,649 to 10,608 (less than half a percentage point) in the two years up to the end of 1988. By contrast, the women have increased from 439 to 503 in one year (1988), an increase of nearly 15 per cent. Moreover, taking into account the age structure of the men and probable rates of entry to, and departures from, the ministry, these trends are likely to continue over the next few years: figures for the men decreasing to perhaps around 10,300 by 1994, and for the women rising to around 750 in the same period.

It should be emphasised that these figures refer only to those full-time stipendiary clergy who work within - for want of a better phrase - "the diocesan framework": diocesan, suffragan and area bishops, archdeacons, cathedral and parochial clergy and certain diocesan appointments. They do not include clergy working full-time in hospitals, prisons, the Services, education or other sectors. At present an overall total for these is difficult to come by, but it is estimated that there are at least 2,000. Some sectors, notably hospital chaplaincies, are growing.

SELECTION CONFERENCE RECOMMENDATIONS

In the five year period up to 1988 for which figures are given (see Tables 27 and 28) numbers for men recommended for the stipendiary ministry peaked at 363 in 1986, then dropped to 320 in 1987 and 252 in 1988. These decreases in the main reflect the numbers coming forward for selection, rather than an increased stringency on the part of the selectors. On a more hopeful note, there are indications that after the comparatively lean years of 1987 and 1988, the numbers of men coming forward are increasing. The numbers of women recommended for the ordained ministry have been virtually constant and are likely to remain so for this year.

DEACONESSES, LAY WORKERS AND READERS

A large proportion of the women ordained as stipendiary deacons in 1987 and 1988 had previously been deaconesses. Indeed, only 15 stipendiary deaconesses remain, and it is unlikely that any more will be licensed. With the exception of Church Army personnel working in the parishes, the number of licensed stipendiary lay workers is not reliably known. It is likely to be under 100. The total number of licensed readers has continued to increase gradually. Whilst the number of male readers has decreased by three per cent over the past five years, the number of women readers has increased by 45 per cent.

MEMBERSHIP

As always, the lack of any clear definition of membership in the Church of England has made it difficult to be precise on recent trends. Compared with 1986, Easter communicants have risen by nearly four per cent and electoral roll figures are virtually static. (A separate collection of electoral roll numbers from the dioceses for 1989 showed a very small increase over the 1987 figures collected from the parishes). Christmas and normal Sunday communicants, usual Sunday attendances and infant baptisms have again dropped, but by amounts of less than one per cent in each case. Only the numbers of baptisms of those other than infants and confirmations have continued to show real evidence of decline (drops of five and nine per cent respectively).

It is therefore not fanciful to talk of a plateau in membership numbers. In view of recent media interest, it should be emphasised that because of their cyclic nature and imperfect reflection of numbers of active churchgoers, electoral roll increases are not in themselves firm evidence of increased membership overall.

GIVING AND CHARITABLE DONATIONS

In the last edition we reported that in 1985 direct giving (i.e. the combined total of net covenants, other non-covenanted planned giving and proceeds of collections and boxes) had in real terms risen to its highest level since 1968. This rise has been maintained. Allowing for inflation, such giving increased by five per cent per year in 1986 and 1987. It has reached a level last seen in 1964, when church membership was considerably larger. This growth, together with the increasing proportion of money coming from covenanted giving is illustrated in the graph on page 29.

At the same time, the overall position of "fewer people giving more" is underlined by the two per cent drop in the total number of planned giving (covenanted and uncovenanted) subscribers between 1986 and 1987. The reduction has been more marked in the number of uncovenanted subscribers, but it is worth noting that up to 1985 the number of covenanted subscribers had shown a sustained rise over many years.

In real terms, charitable donations by parishes rose by nearly ten per cent between 1985 and 1986, but then level-pegged with inflation in the following year. The proportion of total ordinary expenditure given by parishes to outside charitable bodies in this period dropped from 11.2 to 10.6 per cent.

Finally, it should be noted that among the 13,000 parishes there are a small but growing number (currently some 300) of Local Ecumenical Projects in which there is a congregation and ministry shared between the Church of England and certain other denominations. In such circumstances it is not always possible (or indeed desirable) to isolate the Anglican component of the congregation. The parochial membership figures will therefore include a small element which may appear also in the statistics of other Churches.

Defintions

In the tables relating to parish finance, components of income and expenditure are defined as follows:



THE CLERGY

Although various statistics relating to clergyman in the Church of England have been published for many years, their present value is limited by the lack of comparability, which itself arises from the way the various categories of clergy are defined. It is only in the last 12 years that, as a result of central payment of clergy stipends by the Church Commissioners and of the requirements of the Sheffield deployment formula (see page 12) a standard definition has been adopted. This includes all those full-time stipendiary clergymen working within the diocesan structure. Thus the figures in Table 2 below are not comparable with the later ones shown in Table 3, mainly because the 'non-parochial' category in the first table includes a large number of clergy working in hospital, prison, educational and other sector ministries outside the diocesan structure.

DEPLOYMENT OF THE CLERGY

Male clergy: the 'Sheffield' formula

The 'Sheffield' formula for the deployment of the clergy was devised by a Working Group appointed by the House of Bishops and under the chairmanship of the then Bishop of Sheffield. It was first published in the Group's report in May 1974 (GS 205). The House considered the report and in January 1975 carried motions which accepted the broad principles on which the report was based and the formula which it proposed should be used to calculate each diocese's share of the available ordained manpower. The intention was to enable the Church, over a period of years, to use the manpower that was available in the most effective way possible, and in a manner which would ensure fairer shares as between dioceses than the existing distribution, based on historical patterns rather than present needs, provided. The formula has since been reviewed — see The Church's Ministry —A Survey' (GS 459, November 1980) and 'The Deployment of the Stipendiary Clergy' (GS 511, December 1981). One minor modification was made in 1988 to the membership factor (see below).

The formula apportions the total number of full-time, stipendiary clergy available to the 43 dioceses (Europe, because of the special nature of its chaplaincies, is not included) on the basis of four factors, weighted as shown:

Diocesan population (8) to reflect the number of persons for whom a pastoral responsibility is assumed;

Diocesan area (1) to reflect the larger distances to be covered in rural dioceses;

Membership (3) to reflect the number of Church members to be cared for. Prior to 1988 this was measured solely by Electoral Roll numbers; for 1988 and later years it has been

measured solely by Electoral Roll numbers; for 1988 and later years it has been measured by

one-third (Electoral Roll members) plus two-thirds (usual Sunday attendances,

all ages).

Number of churches (3) to reflect the number of services in different churches that need to be provided.

Shares under the formula are published each year from figures supplied by the Church Commissioners. The latest available statistics are always used.

Additionally, projections of future clergy numbers, and each diocese's share, are prepared from time to time. These are based on known trends in retirements, resignations and deaths in service, together with assumptions on the future level of ordinands and others entering the diocesan framework.

The shares yielded by the 'Sheffield' formula are therefore targets towards which dioceses should work. It should however be emphasised that the targets are moving ones; they depend not only on the total number of men available (or, in the case of projections, the validity of the trends and assumptions) but also on the relative changes in dioceses' populations and other relevant statistics.

Female clergy

A formula to allocate full-time stipendiary women deacons and deaconesses among the dioceses was approved by the House of Bishops in 1988. It is based half on historic and half on 'Sheffield-type' considerations. The historic component is based on the number of such women working in each diocese over a period of up to six years (at present, comparable figures are available for only two years). The other component consists of the four 'Sheffield' Factors, with the same weights as for the male clergy.

As with the men, shares under the formula are published each year from figures supplied by the Church Commissioners. The latest available statistics are used. At present, trends in entries to and exits from this ministry are not sufficiently well-established to allow for other than very tentative projections of future numbers.

Diagram 2A: Men





Diagram 2B: Women



The cash amounts in the upper graph are adjusted to 1987 purchasing power


