#### FOREWORD

#### General

This edition of "Church Statistics" marks another milestone in the development of the publication: it is the first to be produced entirely within Church House. Because of this we have again been able to hold our cover price (but not the postage) at what it was two years ago, albeit for a slightly shorter booklet.

In the last edition, we touched briefly on some of the problems associated with the Central Board's annual collection of statistics from the parishes. In particular, we mentioned the difficulties of reducing the two year time-lag between the currency of the figures and the date of publication of the results. In the present financial climate, more up-to-date parochial figures would clearly be very desirable, and we are planning to bring forward the production of the 1993 figures. This may mean that the processing of the 1992 statistics will have to be restricted. We are looking to see what can be done, with a view to producing the next edition earlier in the year.

#### The Clergy

The number of full-time stipendiary male clergy decreased further during 1992: from 10,375 to 10,247. In the same year, the corresponding number of women deacons rose from 674 to 707, making a net reduction of 95 clergy. It has now become clear that a number of dioceses have moved from a position in which clergy are a scarce resource to one in which more clergy are available than resources to pay them. A sign of this is in the Sheffield allocations (Table 17), where the total number allocated to dioceses is for the first time greater than the total in post: the difference of 19 men is the number then known to be available for stipendiary ministry but not employed in it.

#### Membership

Recent reports in the national press that "the Church of England lost 21 per cent of its worshippers between 1975 and 1992" sent us scurrying between our telephones and our computers. Was it true, people wanted to know. We cannot say; the Central Board collected no membership figures in 1975 and our 1992 statistics are still in preparation. If we look at our 1976 figures and compare them with the latest (1991) another question arises: what is a "worshipper"? Usual Sunday attendances over this period show a decrease of 9 per cent; in the same period electoral rolls (no doubt influenced to some extent by their use in calculating parochial quotas) dropped by nearly 30 per cent. It is common knowledge that the Church of England, as with most mainstream churches, has had substantial membership losses over the past thirty years or so. However, from the mid-eighties onwards, the decline in attendances has been markedly smaller than in the previous two decades. Moreover, the overall figures often conceal wide variations within them. For example, Sunday attendance

figures have dropped by about 2.6 per cent in the period 1986 to 1991. But as Table 12 on page 9 shows, this reduction occurred almost entirely within the under-16 age group; adult attendances changed hardly at all.

In 1990, Easter communicants increased over the previous year by one per cent and Christmas communicants dropped by the same amount. The following year, the pattern was reversed: the Easter figures were down (by 4 per cent) and the Christmas ones up (by two per cent) on 1990. Reasons for the fluctuation, other than a statistical quirk or the weather, are hard to come by. Perhaps more significant is the increase in Confirmations in 1992. These figures come directly from the offices of the diocesan bishops, and should reflect the reality very closely. 29 out of 43 dioceses reported increased numbers, making an overall rise of just under 4 per cent on 1991: the first such increase for twelve years. Again, no single reason has been advanced for these gratifying results, and it remains to be seen whether the increase will be sustained in 1993.

#### **Finance**

Figures for 1990 had shown that whilst parochial income from giving had increased, it had done so at a rate marginally below inflation: the first time in 15 years that giving had dropped in real terms. It is therefore gratifying to report that the latest (1991) figures from the parishes show a resumption of the earlier pattern. Covenanted giving, which, excluding reclaimed tax, accounts for over one third of the total given to the church for its day-to-day purposes, rose by over 3 per cent above inflation and uncovenanted planned giving, which includes Give-as -you -Earn, increased by over 5 per cent. Only loose-plate collections, which nowadays account for around a quarter of total "ordinary" giving (i.e. excluding appeals and other giving for special capital purposes), failed to keep their value. Thus direct giving, which is the sum total of these three items, showed an increase above inflation of 2 per cent. In terms of per-head giving, this was equivalent to an average of £2.72 per week per church member, up from £2.54 the previous year.

Charitable giving by Parochial Church Councils in 1991 was also up on the previous year, but has just failed to keep pace with inflation. Again, the largest portion (some £8.7 million, or one third of the total) went to the Anglican missionary societies. However, the largest increase was in donations to the relief and development agencies such as Christian Aid and the TEAR Fund. The charitable giving figures need to be viewed with some caution, for in addition to the usual problems of estimating for missing or inconsistent data, it is not always possible for parishes to distinguish between donations made by PCCs on behalf of congregations as a whole, and individual donations, often from persons with little or no connection to the church, to specified charities for which the PCC acts merely as a forwarding agency.

The term "church member" when related to giving (Tables 31 and 32) is defined as: two thirds (adult usual Sunday attendances) plus one third (electoral roll membership).

#### Please also note that :

- Many figures in this booklet have been rounded, and that in general totals, percentages and averages were calculated before rounding. Hence row and column totals will not always agree exactly with the sum of the stated amounts.
- 2. Among the 13,000 parishes of the Church of England there is a small number (around 300) of Local Ecumenical Projects in which there is a congregation and a ministry shared between the Church of England and certain other churches. In such circumstances it is not always possible (or indeed desirable) to isolate the Anglican component of the congregation. The parochial membership figures will therefore include a small element which may appear also in the statistics of other churches.
- Where figures are not available for any reason, "n.a." appears in the tables.



## **DEPLOYMENT OF THE CLERGY**

**Deployment Formulae** 

Male clergy: the "Sheffield" formula

The "Sheffield" formula for the deployment of the clergy was devised by a Working Group appointed by the House of Bishops under the chairmanship of the then Bishop of Sheffield. It was first published in May 1974. The intention was to enable the Church, over a period of years, to use the manpower that was available in a manner which would ensure fairer shares as between dioceses than the existing distribution, based on historical patterns rather than present needs, provided. The formula, which has undergone little change since its inception, is currently being reviewed.

At present the formula apportions the total number of full-time, stipendiary clergy in post in the 43 dioceses (Europe, because of the special nature of its chaplaincies, is not included) on the basis of four factors, weighted as shown in the brackets:

Diocesan population (8)	to reflect the number of persons for whom a pastoral
	responsibility is assumed:

Diocesan area (1) to reflect the larger distances to be covered in rural

dioceses;

Membership (3) to reflect the number of Church members to be cared

for. Since 1988 it has been measured by: one-third (Electoral Roll members) plus two-thirds (usual

Sunday attendances, all ages).

Number of churches (3) to reflect the number of services in different churches

that need to be provided.

Shares under the formula are published each year from figures supplied by the Church Commissioners (see Table 17 opposite). The latest available statistics are used.

#### Female clergy: the "Lambeth" formula

A formula to allocate full-time stipendiary women deacons and deaconesses among the dioceses was approved by the House of Bishops in 1988. It is based half on historic and half on "Sheffield-type" considerations. The historic component is based on the number of such women working in each diocese over a period of up to six years. The other component consists of the four "Sheffield" factors, with the same weights as for the male clergy.

As with men, shares under the formula are published each year from figures supplied by the Church Commissioners.




## Overall Recommendations 1982 - 1992




