FOREWORD

Introduction

This edition of *Church Statistics* contains details of parochial statistics for the calendar year 1997. As always thanks are due to the dioceses and the parishes whose co-operation in processing and completing the annual returns remains crucial to the successful gathering of the information required for this publication.

Last year saw the production for the first time of *The Church of England, Today'*, an A4 pamphlet which provided in headline form a broad statistical picture of the Church of England. The pamphlet, which was distributed to all parishes, was well received and an updated version will be published shortly. The next edition of the publication 'Statistics of Licensed Ministers', to be published in the early summer of 1999, will provide a comprehensive description of the Church's ministry as at 31 December 1998.

For the first time 'Church Statistics' includes information relating to the Diocese in Europe and it is intended that as more information becomes available the range of statistics included will increase.

Finance

Once again the increase in income to parishes through planned giving was above the rate of inflation. In 1997 the total amount covenanted showed an increase of 5.4% on the 1996 figure, some 2.1% above inflation. The number of individuals covenanting their giving has decreased slightly over this period whilst the average weekly covenant has increased by 6.1% and is now £5.96. The total amount of money given to the Church through collections and planned giving rose by 5.0% between 1996 and 1997 which, allowing for inflation, represents a real increase of 1.8%.

Care needs to be taken when comparing the total income and expenditure figures of the parishes for 1997 with the corresponding figures for 1996. As compared with 1996 the ordinary income of parishes rose by 8.5% and the ordinary expenditure by 7.9%. In part these increases can probably be explained by changes in the accounting practices of parishes resulting from the implementation of the Charities Act 1993. The information provided by parishes is beginning to reflect a fuller picture of parochial finances now that parishes are beginning to disclose their restricted funds.

For the Church as a whole in 1997, 82% of the ordinary income of the parishes came from planned giving, tax refunds on covenants, donations, collections and fund-raising. Of the total direct giving in 1997 (money coming from planned giving and collections) 58% was tax efficient – that is given under covenant.


Statistics Review

During the last six months the Statistics Review Group, chaired by the Bishop of Wakefield, has been engaged in the process of evaluating the various statistics used to describe participation in the life of the Church. In October 1998 a conference entitled 'Statistics, A Tool for Mission' was hosted jointly by the Statistics Unit and the Board of Mission. An audience made up of diocesan representatives from mission, ministry, communications and finance received presentations from Church House staff, diocesan missioners, academics and representatives from other Christian denominations. The intention was to challenge individuals on the way statistics are used within the Church and to provoke a debate on what is meant by membership.

The Review Group is seeking to encourage a wide debate on how statistics might be better used to promote the mission of the Church and would be happy to receive written submissions^(*). In July 1999 there will be a fringe meeting at the York Group of Sessions at which the steering group will present some preliminary findings.

DEFINITIONS

Income

In the tables relating to finance, components of income and expenditure are defined as follows:

Total planned giving

= net covenants including regular Gift Aid donations and non-covenanted planned giving, e.g. through envelope schemes.

Total direct giving

planned giving plus church collections and boxes.

Other voluntary income

- all other voluntary income for ordinary expenditure excluding direct giving and income tax on covenants. e.g. fund-raising

events, net profit on magazine/bookstall, sundry donations.

Total voluntary income Other ordinary income

- direct giving plus income tax on covenants plus other voluntary income.

- dividends and interest, recurring diocesan and other grants, and all other income for expenditure on ordinary purposes of the PCC, net surplus from church hall or other buildings, income from endowments or trust funds if used for ordinary purposes.

Total ordinary income

- total voluntary income plus other ordinary income.

Expenditure

The Church Overseas

- payments to:

(a) the recognised missionary societies, or other overseas missions, diocesan associations Diocesan Mission Councils. (b) Christian organisations primarily concerned with relief and development.

Home Missions

- payments to home missions and other Church societies and organisations, (including the Church Urban Fund).

Other Charities

Total ordinary expenditure

= payments to other charities which are secularly based.

- the total of ALL expenditure (including charitable giving) for the ordinary purposes of the PCC. i.e. excluding only non-recurring items of capital expenditure and non-revenue items.

Please also note that:

- 1. Whilst many figures in this booklet have been rounded, totals, percentages and averages were calculated before rounding. Hence row and column totals will not always agree exactly with the sum of the stated amounts.
- 2. Among the 13,000 parishes of the Church of England there are around 750 Local Ecumenical Projects in roughly half of which there is a congregation and a ministry shared between the Church of England and certain other churches. In such circumstances it is not always possible (or indeed desirable) to isolate the Anglican component of the congregation. The parochial statistics will therefore include a small element which may appear also in the statistics of other churches,
- 3. Where figures are not available for any reason, "n.a." appears in the tables.





