


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FOREWORD

Introduction

This edition of *Church Statistics* contains details of parochial statistics for the calendar year 1999. Thanks are due to the dioceses and the parishes whose co-operation in processing and completing the annual returns continues to remain crucial to the successful gathering of the information required for this publication. This edition includes as much appropriate information as possible from the Diocese in Europe. The next edition of the publication *'Statistics of Licensed Ministers'*, to be published in the summer of 2001, will provide a comprehensive description of the Church's ministry as at 31 December 2000.

Membership and Attendance Statistics

In 2000, the Church of England concluded a major review of its annual statistical information collection from parishes. Figures reported by the parishes for 1999 and collated in this edition of *Church Statistics*, consequently represent the final year of data collection prior to the national review.

Patterns of church attendance have altered radically in recent years due to clergy deployment factors and major sociological changes in family life and leisure time. Recorded levels of attendance at church services have decreased significantly as a result of less frequent church attendance in addition to changing patterns of church services. Between 1998 and 1999 the **number of people** on church electoral rolls increased by 0.7% while the total adult usual Sunday attendance decreased by 0.5% and the total child usual Sunday attendance decreased by 2.3%. Easter Day and Christmas Day communicants both decreased, the former by 1.1% and the latter by 6.3%. Many churches provided additional opportunities for worship at the conclusion to 1999 as the nation celebrated the arrival of the year 2000. Attendance at these events was significant and may have detracted from church services at Christmas 1999.

During 1999, the number of **baptisms** of children, teenagers and adults increased by 12% while the number of infant baptisms decreased by 2.7%. Chart D illustrates the changing trends in baptismal numbers over recent years. In the provinces of Canterbury and York approximately 1 in 5 and 1 in 4, respectively, of infants continue to be baptised. Baptism figures will continue to be reported in future years but enhanced by the collection of other data relating to services of thanksgiving, marriages, blessings of marriage and funerals. The breadth of statistics reflecting the diversity of church life will increase significantly from 2000, following the Statistics Review Group vision to promote the use of statistics as a tool for mission in the Church of England.

Finance

For many years the Church has gathered information from parishes on **giving by deed of covenant**. A deed had to be signed and witnessed and was a legal document in which the donor agreed to give a certain sum for more than three years. This was convenient for the gathering of data that could be assumed to relate to planned givers (because of the four-year or more commitment). Information was also collected on the tax recovered on the deeds and the number of donors - or 'subscribers' as they are called, because the donation might come on behalf of a family unit rather than just an individual. When the question is asked 'How much is given to the Church each week?' it is encouraging that in 1999 the average weekly donation per subscriber by deed of covenant continued to rise to £6.71 - an increase of 3.7% above the rate of inflation (ref Chart B). Over the 1990s covenanted giving has increased by over 50% (relative to inflation) while the number of subscribers has remained almost static at approximately 400,000.

The picture of financial giving to the Church was complicated by the use of **Payroll Giving and Gift Aid**, but the levels of giving by these means was very low and did not significantly alter the overall picture (although it might have altered the picture in a particular parish). Other data are included in this publication but it is difficult to obtain an accurate average for giving levels by other people. We have no means, for example, of counting the number who give in loose cash in the collection plate or by donations in church boxes or at fetes and bazaars). However, we do know that total direct giving to the Church is approximately twice the amount covenanted and that despite increased overheads, the total charitable donations by PCCs is approximately 8% of their ordinary expenditure (ref pages 16 and 21). Chart A reveals that while 66% (two-thirds) of PCC income was unrestricted ordinary income, 25% (a quarter) remained one-off gifts.

1999 was the last year in which the Church can gather meaningful data on deeds of covenant because the new arrangements for Gift Aid were introduced by the government on April 2000. These new arrangements could bring a further £20 million into the Church in a full year if half the giving that is not currently tax-efficient is given by Gift Aid. It is important that donors make the best use of these arrangements to maximise the income from recovered tax. These options will complicate the presentation of future financial statistics. We are discussing with parishes appropriate information which will give a useful picture but will not involve parishes in undue additional work.

DEFINITIONS

In the tables relating to finance, components of income and expenditure are defined as follows:

Income

Total planned giving = net covenants including regular Gift Aid donations and non-covenanted planned giving, e.g. through envelope schemes.

Total direct giving = planned giving plus church collections and boxes.

Other voluntary income all other voluntary income for ordinary expenditure excluding direct giving and income tax on covenants. e.g. fund-raising events, net profit on magazine/bookstall, sundry donations.

Total voluntary income = direct giving plus income tax on covenants plus other voluntary income.

Other ordinary income = dividends and interest, recurring diocesan and other grants, and all other income for expenditure on ordinary purposes of the PCC, net surplus from church hall or other buildings, income from endowments or trust funds if used for ordinary purposes.

Total ordinary income = total voluntary income plus other ordinary income.

Expenditure

The Church Overseas = payments to:

- (a) the recognised missionary societies, or other overseas missions, diocesan associations Diocesan Mission Councils.
- (b) Christian organisations primarily concerned with relief and development.

Home Missions = payments to home missions and other Church societies and organisations, (including the Church Urban Fund).

Other Charities = payments to other charities which are secularly based.

Total ordinary expenditure = the total of ALL expenditure (including charitable giving) for the ordinary purposes of the PCC. i.e. excluding only non-recurring items of capital expenditure and non-revenue items.

NOTES

- Whilst many figures in this booklet have been rounded, totals, percentages and averages were calculated before rounding. Hence row and column totals will not always agree exactly with the sum of the stated amounts.
- 2. Among the 13,000 parishes of the Church of England there are around 750 Local Ecumenical Projects in roughly half of which there is a congregation and a ministry shared between the Church of England and certain other churches. In such circumstances it is not always possible (or indeed desirable) to isolate the Anglican component of the congregation. The parochial statistics will therefore include a small element which may appear also in the statistics of other churches.
- 3. Figures for **cathedrals** and **the Diocese in Europe** are included as far as possible. Their inclusion is most frequently inappropriate in the finance tables.
- 4. Unrestricted income is income that may be used by the PCC for general church expenses. Restricted income is income given for a specified purpose. (Income which a PCC designates for a specified purpose is considered to be unrestricted, since the PCC and not the donor is determining how it is to be used.)
- Ordinary income includes direct giving, other voluntary income and any other recurring income. One-off income includes non-recurring grants, legacies, special appeals, insurance claims and the sale of fixed assets.
- 6. Ordinary expenditure includes donations to charities, parish share/quota, clergy expenses, church running costs, costs relating to trading, salaries and support costs. Capital expenditure includes major repairs, redecoration and new building work.










Over the 1990s there has been a steady decline in the number of infants baptised each year but increases in the numbers of children, young people and adults baptised. In 1999, 70% of the people baptised were infants, 24% were children and 6% were aged 13 years or over. These percentages reveal a shift in baptismal practise over the ten year period. Of those people baptised in 1990, 80% were infants aged under one year, 15% were children aged between 1 and 12 years and the remaining 4% were aged 13 years or over.
