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- Diocesan-level figures relate to diocesan boundaries at the time.
- Ways in which data are presented have changed over time; not everything in this document is necessarily presented the way that we would choose to do it today.

## Foreword

### Introduction

*Church Statistics 2000* provides the first fruit of new data collection methods used among Church of England parishes and cathedrals at the turn of the millennium. We are particularly grateful to the dioceses and the parishes for being willing to embrace new aspects to the annual parochial return exercise. Their co-operation continues to remain crucial to the successful gathering of the information required for this publication. This edition includes as much appropriate information as possible from the diocese in Europe and from diocesan cathedrals.

### New attendance statistics

Following a major review of annual statistical information collection from parishes, new attendance measures were designed with dioceses across the summer of 2000. That autumn the first and perhaps most significant change was effected successfully across the majority of dioceses. Up and down the length and breadth of England, churches began to count the attendance levels at their church services throughout four weeks in October. There is no single period in the year when church attendance could be said to be 'normal' or even 'average' but October is accepted by our ecumenical partners as the easiest and most comparable month in which to carry out this quantitative exercise.

It would be wrong to make direct comparisons between the numbers found to be in our church services across October 2000 and figures which churches had hitherto reported as their usual Sunday attendance. Examination of the attendance levels collated in this publication in tables 11 and 12 do, however, reveal ***a larger church than was previously understood***. On average 1.3 million people attended church based services of worship each week, 1 million of these on Sundays. Numbers fluctuate week by week, among adults on average doubling at points across the month while almost quadrupling among children and young people. Across a typical month in the year parish church and cathedral worship attracts 1.9 million people but only 1.5 million of these will attend on Sundays. The Church is indeed a seven days a week Church.

Easter and Christmas are traditionally festivals in the Christian year when many attend special occasions of worship in our parish churches and cathedrals. Churches and cathedrals were asked to estimate attendance levels at these festivals for the first time in 2000. The results are surprising and in the case of cathedrals reflects steadily

increasing numbers throughout the year. 2.9 million people attended church and cathedral worship on Christmas Day/Eve 2000 while 1.6 million attended on Easter Day. Christmas services attract over twice the average weekly attendance of our churches and cathedrals. Allowing for other services of worship (carols, Christingle, etc) not included in this Christmas count, ***the size of the church in England, if portrayed in these terms, is approaching 3 million people which is three times the figure of 1 million often cited in the public arena.*** The growing importance of this Christian festival in people's lives is revealed by the increase of 11 per cent in Christmas communicants.

### Occasional offices

The church has traditionally monitored Electoral Roll and baptism levels but in 2000, parishes and cathedrals were asked to estimate the number of occasions where people received direct pastoral contact through the remaining occasional offices. Marriages can be performed in places other than churches and cathedrals. Tables 18 and 19 (based on local authority registrars returns) indicate that a quarter of marriages are performed by Church of England ministers. Local churches have significant opportunities for mission and ministry through approaching 470,000 occasional offices performed by their ministers in 2000. Funerals accounted for nearly half of these and many clergy find themselves unsupported in this particular ministry. Baptisms and thanksgivings represent over a third of the occasional offices, marriages and blessings of civil marriages about 1 in 6. At these essentially family and community events, local churches have unique opportunities for contact among a wide constituency.

### Finance

2000 was the year that the government's 'Getting Britain Giving in the 21st Century' campaign took effect. From April 6<sup>th</sup> there were three main changes to tax-effective giving:

- deeds of covenant became invalid for tax recovery purposes and were replaced by changes to the Gift Aid arrangements;
- the benefits of Payroll Giving were enhanced by the removal of an upper limit and the addition of a 10 per cent government bonus for three years;
- improvements were made to the mechanism for giving shares tax-efficiently.

The aim was to encourage more people to give to charitable organisations and to encourage increased levels of giving.

The data contained in this publication combines primarily deed of covenant data for the first three months of the year and Gift Aid data for the rest of the year. The government believes that it will take three years for the changes to fully take effect and the Church got off to a good start with training sessions for parish officers in all dioceses.

2000 was really too soon to see the full effects of the new giving arrangements but the following can be seen:

- The number of donors giving in a planned and tax-efficient way increased by 10 per cent to 436,000. It is likely that 34,000 of these were already planned givers but they now feel able to use Gift Aid to make their giving tax-efficient.
- Planned, tax-efficient giving increased by 10 per cent to over £151 million. (However some of these new givers are probably giving at a lower level than others and, while the total given has increased, the average level of giving has reduced by 5p a week.)
- Tax recovered has increased by over 8 per cent but this probably does not show the full effect of the new arrangements as many PCCs will have made tax recovery claims earlier in the year before the new arrangements took effect.

Before the new Payroll Giving arrangements were known the decision had been taken to ask a specific question about this method of giving. The sum given in this way is less than 1 per cent of the total planned giving income and less than 1 per cent of donors use this method of giving. Payroll Giving will be helpful to some donors but not all. Giving has to be arranged through one's employer and, because the sum given is made before the deduction of tax, a Gift Aid donation of £100 must be increased to £128 through Payroll Giving to be the same value to the church.

### Summary

Today people support their local church (and cathedral) in many ways. Whilst the quantitative information above is not fully comprehensive, it does provide a healthy picture of the variety of local church life. Church attendance patterns, occasional offices, the increased diversity of ordained and lay ministries, financial giving and other measures of church support are evolving at the turn of the millennium in ways which may not be as pessimistic as many commentators have portrayed. The collection of both quantitative and qualitative information must remain under constant review so that it can properly adapt to and reflect the changing nature of religious practise in our country.

## Definitions

In the tables relating to attendance at church services new measures of church attendance have been employed:

**Average Sunday attendance** = the average number of attenders at Sunday church services typically over a four-week period in October.

**Average weekly attendance** = the average number of attenders at church services throughout the week typically over a four-week period in October.

Each of the above measures are provided for adults and children/ young people aged under 16 years. The highest and lowest counts over the four week period are calculated as follows:

**Maximum Sunday/ weekly attendance** = the sum of the highest Sunday (weekly) attendances over the four week period.

**Minimum Sunday/ weekly attendance** = the sum of the lowest Sunday (weekly) attendances over the four week period.

*Attendance figures have only been included where local churches held at least one church based service (which included adult presence) during the week under examination.*

In the tables relating to finance, components of income and expenditure are defined as follows:

### Income

Total planned giving = tax-efficient planned giving including regular Gift Aid donations and non tax-efficient planned giving, e.g. through envelope schemes.

Total direct giving = planned giving plus church collections and boxes.

Other voluntary income = all other voluntary income for ordinary expenditure excluding direct giving and income tax on covenants. e.g. fund-raising events, net profit on magazine/bookstall, sundry donations.

Total voluntary income = direct giving plus income tax on covenants plus other voluntary income.

Other recurring income = dividends and interest, recurring diocesan and other grants, and all other income for expenditure on ordinary purposes of the PCC, net surplus from church hall or other buildings, income from endowments or trust funds if used for ordinary purposes.

Total recurring income = total voluntary income plus other recurring income.

### Expenditure

The church overseas = payments to:

- (a) the recognized missionary societies, or other overseas missions, diocesan associations, diocesan mission councils.
- (b) Christian organizations primarily concerned with relief and development.

Home missions = payments to home missions and other Church societies and organizations, (including the Church Urban Fund).

Other charities = payments to other charities which are secularly based.

Total recurring expenditure = the total of ALL expenditure (including charitable giving) for the ordinary purposes of the PCC i.e. excluding only non-recurring items of capital expenditure and non-revenue items.

## Notes

1. Whilst many figures in this booklet have been rounded, totals, percentages and averages were calculated before rounding. Hence row and column totals will not always agree exactly with the sum of the stated amounts.
2. Among the 13,000 parishes of the Church of England there are around **750 Local Ecumenical Projects** in roughly half of which there is a congregation and a ministry shared between the Church of England and certain other churches. In such circumstances it is not always possible (or indeed desirable) to isolate the Anglican component of the congregation. The parochial statistics will therefore include a small element which may appear also in the statistics of other churches.
3. Figures for **cathedrals** and **the diocese in Europe** are included as far as possible. Their inclusion is most frequently inappropriate in the finance tables.
4. **Unrestricted income** is income that may be used by the PCC for general church expenses. **Restricted income** is income which may not be used for any purpose other than as specified by the donor. (Income which a PCC designates for a specified purpose is considered to be unrestricted, since the PCC and not the donor is determining how it is to be used.)
5. **Recurring income** includes direct giving, other voluntary income and any other recurring income. **One-off income** includes non-recurring grants, legacies, special appeals, insurance claims and the sale of fixed assets.
6. **Recurring expenditure** includes donations to charities, parish share/quota, clergy expenses, church running costs, costs relating to trading, salaries and support costs. **Capital expenditure** includes major repairs, redecoration and new building work.

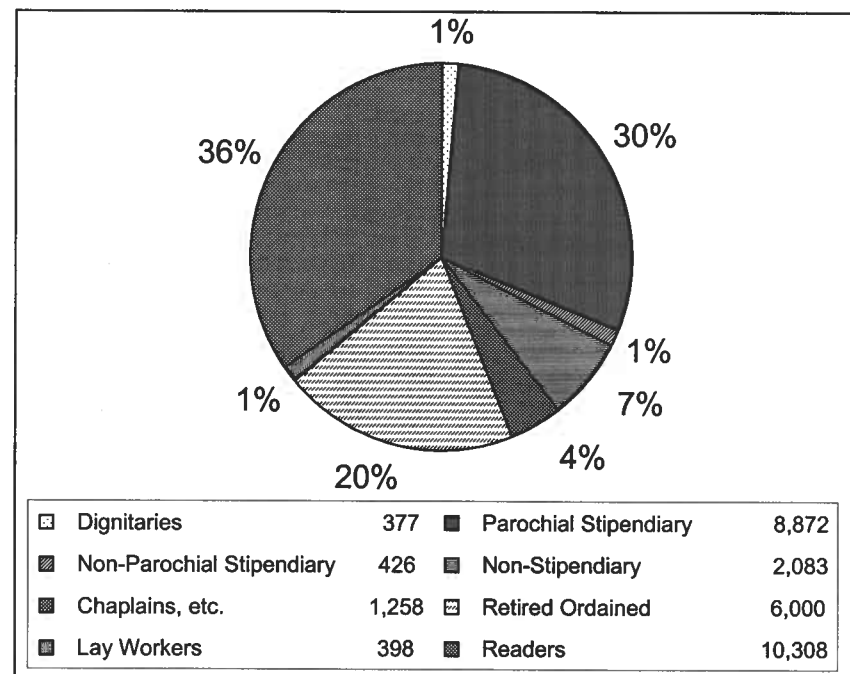

### 4 Comparison of licensed ministries



The figures for dignitaries, parochial clergy, non-parochial diocesan and other clergy and lay workers in figure 4 above and the related tables are based on statistics derived from the central Church payroll. Details of chaplains and other ministers working outside the diocesan framework, and of non-stipendiary clergy, are based on statistics derived from the database used to compile *Crockford's Clerical Directory*. Where possible, they have been cross-referenced with material produced by organizing bodies (e.g. the Home Office for prison chaplains, and the Hospital Chaplaincies Council for hospital chaplains).

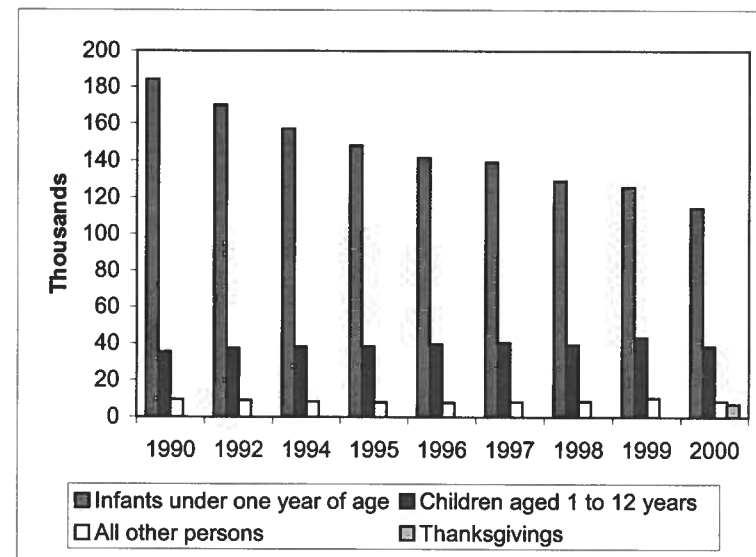

## Baptisms 1990 to 2000



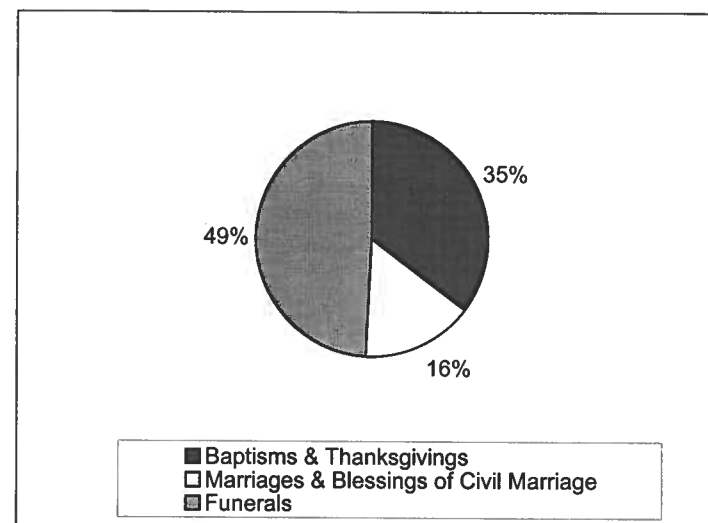
Over the 1990s there has been a steady decline in the number of infants baptized each year but increases in the numbers of children, young people and adults baptized. In 2000, 71 per cent of the people baptized were infants, 24 per cent were children and 5 per cent were aged 13 years or over. These percentages reveal a shift in baptismal practise over the ten year period. Of those people baptized in 1990, 80 per cent were infants aged under one year, 15 per cent were children aged between 1 and 12 years and the remaining 4 per cent were aged 13 years or over.

## Parochial occasional offices



New statistics gathered on the occasional offices reveal that on average each (stipendiary) parochial cleric undertakes one occasional office every week and this is equally split between funerals and the remaining occasional offices. Almost 470,000 occasional offices were taken during the year 2000 by parish and cathedral ministers. Nearly a half were funerals, over a third were baptisms or services of thanksgiving while approximately one in six were marriages or blessings of civil marriages.

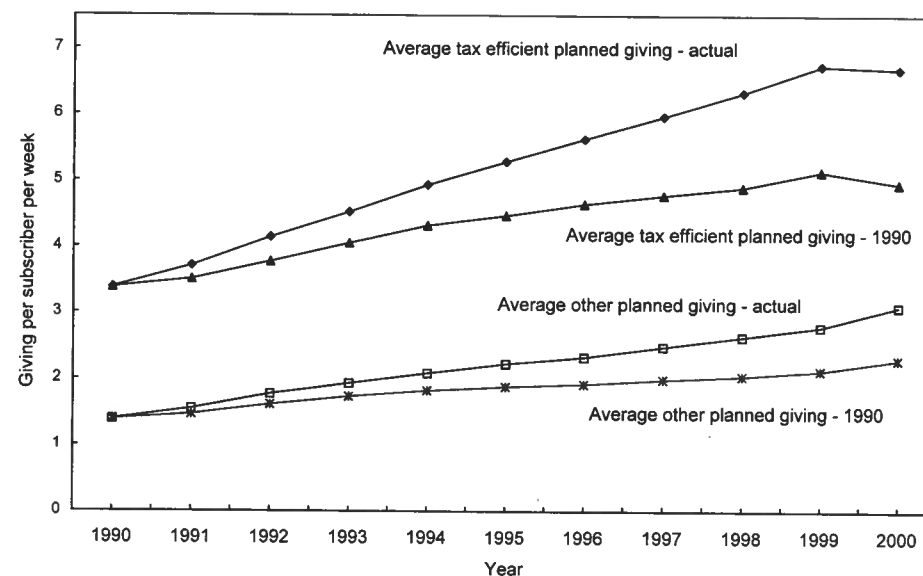

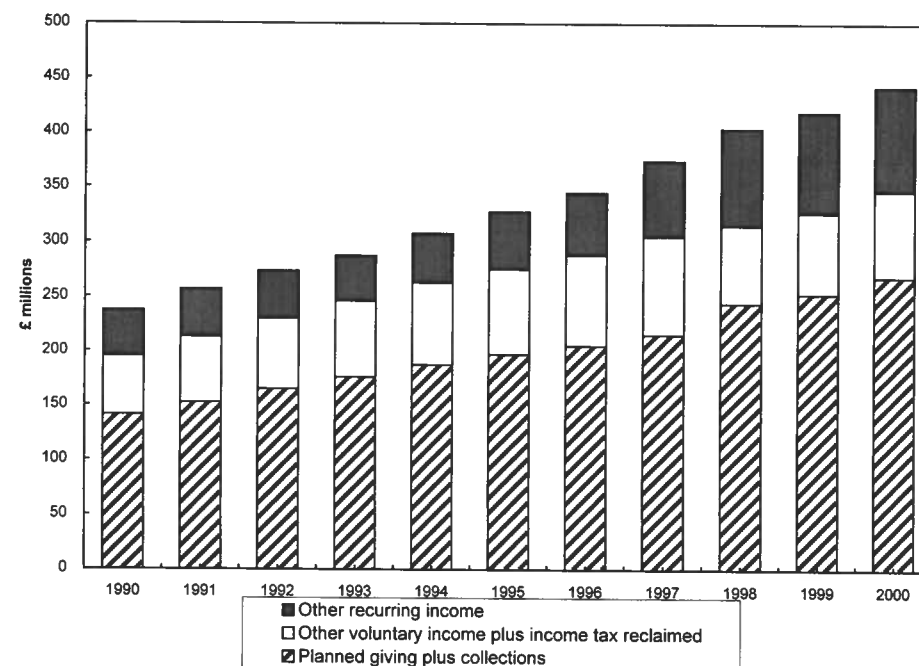

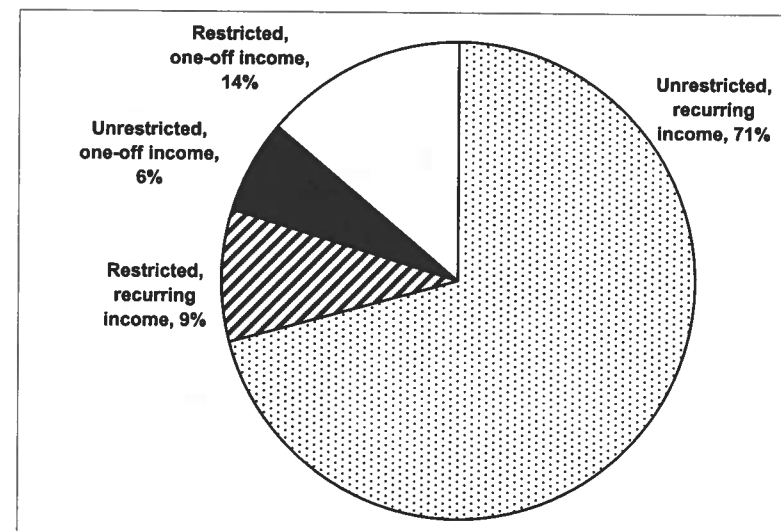

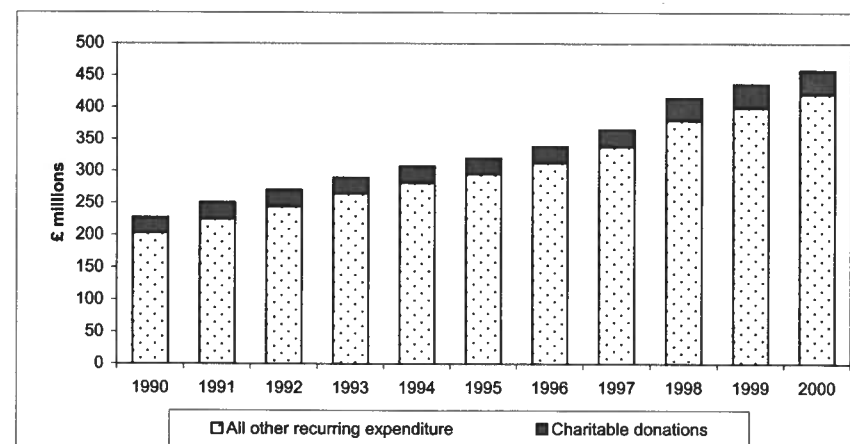

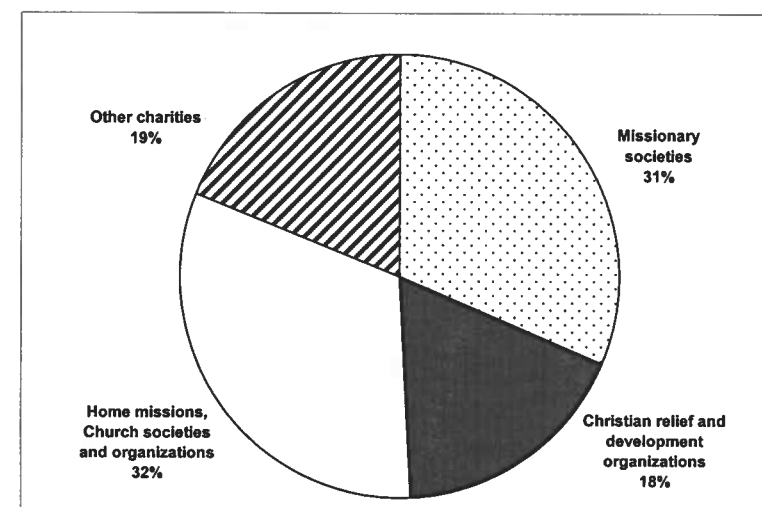
