

- Reaches a new audience
 - Makes everyday tasks more interesting!
 - Walks, commutes, before bed...
- Allows for long form media
- Ideal for niche subjects

Around **7.1 million** people in the UK now listen to podcasts each week. That's **one in eight people** and is an increase of 24% over the past year – and more than double over the past five years. (Ofcom, 2019)

Spotify spent \$600 million on podcasting between 2019 and 2020 (statista)

Why start a podcast?

- It's very easy!
- It can be done no/low budget.
- It fills a gap in your congregation's/audience's media consumption.
- Is a great way to encourage prayer throughout the week – not just on Sundays.

 - A discussion on theology
 - "Magazine Show" Different segments, discussions, interviews with locals

 - Dynamic microphone for home use
 - Recording in church
 - Recording multiple people
 - Accessories (stand, pop filter, cable)
 - Equipment suggestions in last slide

- Phone/Tablet: <u>Auphonic</u>
- Computer: Audacity





Recording and Editing pt.2: Where and how


- Record in WAV format and at a sample rate of 48khz – especially important for video
- Recording environment
 - Limit extraneous sounds
 - Acoustics
 - Duvets!
- Microphone positioning
- Technique





Recording and Editing pt.3: Editing

- Software
- Approaches
 - No Edit
 - Tidying up
 - More advanced
- Auphonic
 - Signal levelling
 - Loudness
 - Noise reduction





Distribution

- What does a distributor do?
 - Hosting
 - Platforms
 - Analytics
- Some options
 - Soundcloud
 - Free up to 3hrs, £7.50 p/m unlimited
 - Buzzsprout
 - Free 2hrs p/m, \$12-\$24 p/m 3-12hrs p/m
 - Captivate
 - £19 p/m unlimited
