Money: A Stewardship Issue

"Holding in trust and managing the estate of another."

"The regarding of ourselves – our time, talents and money – as a trust from God to be utilised in His service."

"Stewardship is the act of organizing your life so that God can spend you."

"What I do after I say, 'I believe'."



Money: A Stewardship Issue

"But who am I, and who are my people, that we should be able to offer as generously as this? For all things come from You, and from Your own hand we have given to You."

1 Chronicles 29:14



Money: A Discipleship Issue

"When it comes to stewardship and generosity do your people know what you want *for* them regarding their finances, or do they just know what you want *from* them?"

Money: A Generosity Issue





The Bible: A Framework for Generosity

- A priority (Deut 26: 2-3, 1 Cor 16:2, 2 Cor 8:5)
- Prayerful (1 Chron 29: 10-14)
- Planned (but not prescriptive) (2 Cor 9:7)
- Proportionate (1 Cor 16:2, 2 Cor 8: 11-13)
- Given in community (Acts 2: 42-47, 2 Cor 8: 13-14)
- Sacrificial (Luke 21: 1-4, 2 Cor 8: 2-4)
- Cheerfully and joyfully given (2 cor 9:6-8)



Steps in Giving

- Survival
 I give a bit when I'm asked
- Supermarket
 I pay for the bits I enjoy
- **Support**The Church is important and I'll support it
- Subscription
 I see myself as a member paying my dues
- Submission
 I am a disciple with all that involves
- Sacrifice
 I am called to be Christ-like and act accordingly





Encouraging Generosity

What might generous giving look like?

10% (tithing)?

5% (General Synod)?

3.3% of take-home pay

(current estimate for givers in the Diocese of Guildford)?

If every giver in the Diocese gave 5% of their take-home pay another £12m would be raised.



Money: A Generosity Issue

"Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

2 Corinthians 9: 6-7



No magic pot of money!







Diocese of Guildford – Total PCC Income 2017



Diocese of Guildford - Total PCC Income 2017




Diocese of Guildford: Total PCC Income (£)





Diocese of Guildford: Planned Giving (£)







"Demographic Time Bomb"






Average age of adults

Fewer people are giving...






Diocese of Guildford: Planned givers

Our survey of a representative cross-section of parishes shows

- most planned givers are 65+.
- the top 10% of planned givers give 45% of all planned giving.

Communication is Key

Giving for Life Survey 2016:

Whilst all parishes provide some reporting on costs (APCM report), only 1 in 5 parishes communicate the mission and ministry impact of giving.










The prosperous commuter belt town of Guildford in Surrey has been named as the inheritance tax capital of the UK.


