And it was revealed unto him by the Holy Ghost, that he should not see death, before he had seen the Lord's Christ. And he came by the Spirit into the temple: and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him after the custom of the law, then he took him up in his arms, and blessed God, and said,

BLESSING OF LIGHT

If you do have a candle, now would be the time to hold it, and if unlit to light it, or to ask an adult to light it. One of the reasons that this festival is often known as Candlemas is that in some churches people would bring their candles to be blessed, both those for use in home and in church. These winter months are cold and, especially now the Christmas lights have been put away. One thing we do in our benefice is we hand out candles and we encourage everyone to light theirs for a few minutes each day throughout the winter, perhaps placed in a window, to pray and remind themselves that Christ has brought his light into our world, and will one day return to dispel all darkness. Please hold your candles as I pray:

Lord God, the springing source of everlasting light, pour into the hearts of your faithful people the brilliance of your eternal splendour, that we, who by these kindling flames light up our homes to your glory, may have the darkness of our souls dispelled, and so be counted worthy to stand before you in that eternal city where you live and reign, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.
