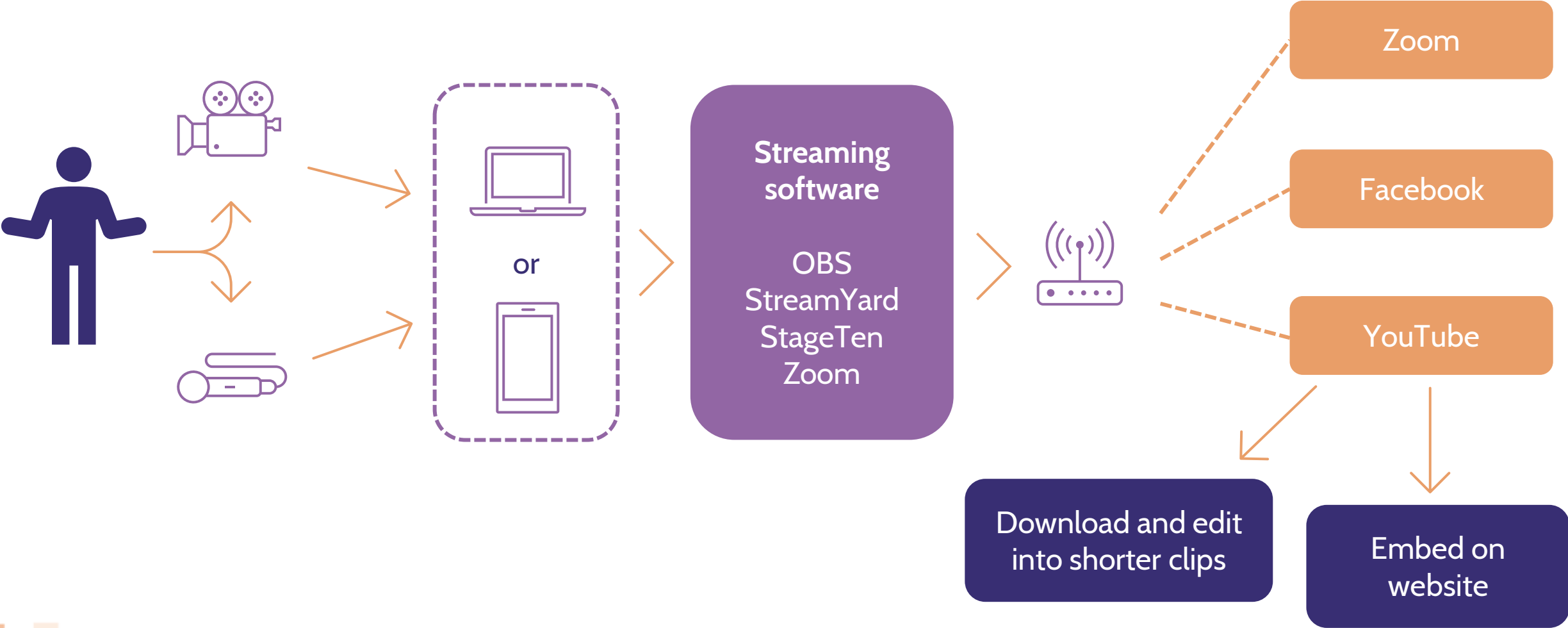

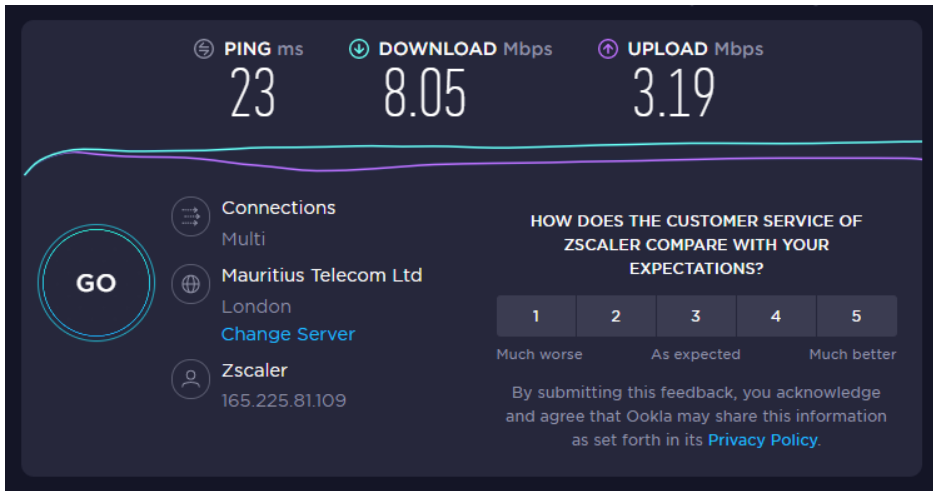

Facebook Live recommends a max bitrate of 4,000 kbps

Streaming software



- Use software to add text overlay, multiple speakers and live and pre-recorded video into your live-stream
- Stream from one place to multiple platforms at the same time
- Creates a visually streamlined experience
- *can be used to record a service which is published afterwards*
- **Free software** – OBS (more complex)
- **Paid software** – Zoom, Streamyard, Stage Ten, Ecamm (all have basic free options)

Zoom tips for audio and video

💡 Touch up my appearance and adjust for low-light

Settings > Video > Tick touch up appearance / Adjust for low-light - Use slider to increase / decrease

🔊 Suppress background noise

Settings > Audio > Suppress background noise

🎵 High Fidelity music mode

Settings > Audio > Tick 'Show in-meeting option...' > Tick 'High Fidelity Music Mode'



Private gatherings:
No licence required
i.e prayer meeting, small group

Social media

Streaming to Facebook, Twitter, YouTube or Instagram:
Licence required such as CCLI streaming licence or One Licence

Website

Video directly uploaded to the website:
PRS limited online music licence

Embedding video from YouTube: Licence required such as per social media

CCLI streaming licence and credit as per the agreement on the Resource Hub
