Welcome to York Minster on this the day of Pentecost. Today we give thanks for the coming of the Holy Spirit bringing to birth the community of people who bear the name of Christ, which we call the Church, spread over all the earth.

The church is a 2000-year-old, two billion strong revolutionary movement of love and justice and for the last nine days between Ascension and Pentecost, Christians around the world have been praying together in many and various ways for the coming of God's Kingdom, as part of a movement of prayer, called Thy Kingdom come, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

It's wonderful to be here today in this magnificent Church, a place where prayers have been said since the year 627. Like every church, this Cathedral was built on the foundation of faith in Jesus Christ, and we stand on that faith today.

Jesus Christ, whom we worship, is our crucified, risen and ascended Lord and we have walked with him through his journey of love. We have faced the agony of his suffering and death on a cross. We have rejoiced at his bursting free from the bonds of death. We have enjoyed his risen presence with us. As he makes himself known as we break bread. We have celebrated his return to the throne before which every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that this Jesus is Lord. And in these last days, just as his first followers did, with the followers of his own time, we await the coming of the promised Holy Spirit, the Father's gift to his people, through whom we make Christ known to the world.

Alleluia. Christ is Risen.

All He is risen indeed. Alleluia.

In 2019 15,000 were able to gather together in Trafalgar Square to celebrate the Festival of Pentecost. Of course things we couldn't have dreamed of have happened in our world since then. We can't gather in those numbers today, but we can raise our voices and join with those who were worshipping that day in the opening hymn 'Ten Thousand Reasons'.

John 15: 26,27 16: 4b- 15

When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning. But I have said these things to you so that when their hour comes you may remember that I told you about them. "I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. But now I am going to him who sent me; yet none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your hearts.

Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. And when he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment: about sin, because they do not believe in me; about righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will see me no longer; about judgment, because the ruler of this world has been condemned. "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now.

When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.
