RACIAL JUSTICE COMMISSION

Summary

A brief presentation on the membership, scope and priorities of the forthcoming Archbishops' Racial Justice Commission, introduced by the Archbishop of York

Background

Following the Windrush debate at General Synod in February 2021, and the intervening From Lament to Action report by the Archbishops' Anti-Racism Taskforce, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York have announced a Racial Justice Commission.

Purpose

This presentation will confirm the membership, scope and priorities of the Racial Justice Commission, which will run for a period of three years and report to the Archbishops on a six-monthly basis.

Format

The presentation will be delivered by the incoming Chair of the Archbishops' Racial Justice Commission together with one of the Co-Chairs of the Archbishops' Anti-Racism Taskforce, and will outline the Commission's plans. A proposal for a debate on *From Lament to Action* will be put to the Business Committee for inclusion at a Group of Sessions in 2022.
