WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION

A warm welcome to All Saints' Church at the heart of the historic market town of Northampton. A church has stood here since at least sometime in the twelfth-century, and while today's place of worship replaces the medieval collegiate church that perished in a fire 340 years ago, it continues as a focal point for our town when we assemble to give thanks, to remember, and to come before God. Today we are celebrating Corpus Christi, the day of thanksgiving for the sacramental gifts of Christ's body and blood in Holy Communion. We are going to celebrate the eucharist, and give thanks for the gladness that Jesus pours into his church as we, his people, gather in his name.

A bell rings. Please stand as the Sacred Ministers enter.

The celebrant returns to the chair for the greeting.


