Anglican Communion Guests

The Most Reverend Dr Josiah Idowu-Fearon is the Secretary General of the Anglican Communion. Prior to his appointment, he served the Anglican Church of Nigeria as Bishop of Kaduna and Archbishop of the Province of Kaduna. He continues to play a role in the region, serving as chair of Kaduna State Peace Commission with the aim of help eradicate conflict between rival groups which is mostly Christians and Muslims. His main focus as Secretary General is serving an ambassadorial role. He

spends much of his time travelling around the Communion, meeting different constituencies

The Most Reverend Dr Titre Ande Georges was installed as Primate in January 2022. He gained a doctorate from Birmingham University in the UK. He was Principal of the Theological College for many years, and still teaches theology. He has been Bishop of Aru for 15 years and has been involved in training church leaders throughout the country.

Ecumenical Guest

<u>Bishop Mark Strange</u> was brought up in Aberdeen where he attended St Andrew's Episcopal Cathedral as a Chorister, Server and Trustee. After School He studied in the Divinity Faculty of the University of Aberdeen while providing his fees by working in the local licensed trade.

After a period of time as Cathedral Verger in Worcester, Bishop Mark began Theological Training at Lincoln Theological College. He served his title at St Barnabas and Christchurch, Worcester before becoming Vicar of St Wulstans, Warndon. After six years running this large urban parish he returned to Scotland in 1998 as Rector of Holy Trinity Elgin, St Margaret's Lossiemouth, St Michael's Dufftown and St Margaret's Aberlour, congregations in central Moray.

Bishop Mark was elected Canon of Inverness Cathedral in 2000 and Synod Clerk in 2003, he was also the Youth Chaplain for the Scottish Province from 2001 until 2010. Bishop Mark was elected Bishop of Moray, Ross and Caithness in 2007 and Primus in 2017.

He and his wife Jane live at Bishop's House, Arpafeelie on the Black Isle, overlooking the mountains of the North.
