GUIDELINES ON EDUCATION AND TRAINING IN THE CONSERVATION OF MONUMENTS, ENSEMBLES AND SITES (1993)

The General Assembly of the International Council on Monuments and Sites, ICOMO meeting in Colombo, Sri Lanka, at its tenth session from July 30 to August 7, 1993;

Considering the breadth of the heritage encompassed within the concept of monument ensembles and sites;

Considering the great variety of actions and treatments required for the conservation of the heritage resources, and the necessity of a common discipline for their guidance;

Recognizing that many different professions need to collaborate within the common discipling of conservation in the process and require proper education and training in order to guarant good communication and coordinated action in conservation;

Noting the Venice Charter and related ICOMOS doctrine, and the need to provide a referent for the institutions and bodies involved in developing training programs, and to assist defining and building up appropriate standards and criteria suitable to meet the specicultural and technical requirements in each community or region;

Adopts the following guidelines, and *Recommends* that they be diffused for the information appropriate institutions, organizations and authorities.

AIM OF THE GUIDELINES


1. The aim of this document is to promote the establishment of standards at guidelines for education and training in the conservation of monuments, groups of buildin ("ensembles") and sites defined as cultural heritage by the World Heritage Convention 1972. They include historic buildings, historic areas and towns, archaeological sites, and townstandard therein, as well as historic and cultural landscapes. Their conservation is now, at will continue to be a matter of urgency.





- Members: Support to Accreditation
 - OPEN Supporter: Starter for all
 - ASSESSED Affiliate: Introductory: 'Aware' (No post-nominals)
 - ACCREDITED Associate: IHBC
 Accredited in generic practice area
 - 'AssocIHBC': 5 year reaccreditation
 - ACCREDITED Full: IHBC Accredited in inter-disciplinary conservation practice
 - 'IHBC'; no re-accreditation; CPD mandatory
- All levels: Same fee, benefits and ethics; no assessment charge!
- **Application:** DEMONSTRATION & REFLECTION, not lists/CVs *etc.*

'Taster' (First timers)

- Administration fee waived
- Full year of total member benefits (+ longer)

Renewal after 12 Months

- Reminder (Spring, not removed till Autumn)
- Fee support: Low waged (e.g. students and volunteers) up to 100%... You must apply!
- Good value fees: 2019-20 £127 (Concessionary £64 if income under £18,500)

Preferential rates for events/support etc.

- Publications
- Bursaries etc.
- Branch events (Low cost)
- Partner events

Minimise costs

- Fees get tax relief: Tell HMRC (cite 'list 3')
 - Automatic deductions
- Crisis support
- Make use of member benefits (partners etc)
- Compare costs & benefits to others
