Access improvements to the Seafarers Chapel of Bristol Cathedral.

We are proposing the following works to improve the chapel which will improve the accessibility of the chapel, particularly for those in wheel chairs or who find walking on uneven surfaces difficult:

- Lift existing floor.
- Install underfloor heating.
- Relay the floor replacing very worn paving slabs.
- Rearrange the monuments to create a more orderly appearance, and a pathway through to the Eastern Lady Chapel for wheelchair users.
- A small number of monuments that are badly damages will not be re-laid.
- Install steel and timber ramps into the Seafarers Chapel from the North Quire Aisle, and into the Quire from the Seafarers Chapel.

- That an Archaeological Watching Brief be carried out during the excavation for all the works (including core drilling of foundations/walls).
- That any significant archaeological deposits or features are hand excavated by a suitably qualified and experienced archaeologist and fully recorded.
- 3. If anything of particular archaeological significance is uncovered that would be disturbed or destroyed by the works, works shall stop to allow for consultation with the Cathedral Archaeologist and shall not recommence until a mitigation strategy has been agreed by him and the Commission notified.

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NOTE:

Within 7 days of receipt of this Notice the administrator of the Cathedral Church is to display a copy of it inside and outside the cathedral where it will be readily visible to the public for a period of not less than 28 days.

- 4. If any human remains are uncovered they shall be treated with due care and decency and in accordance with the guidelines set out in the Advisory Panel on the Archaeology of Burials in England's Guidance for Best Practice for the Treatment of Human Remains Excavated from Christian Burial Grounds in England (2nd edition, 2017). The Commission shall be notified of the discovery of articulated remains.
- A report describing the results of the work will be prepared and circulated to the Cathedrals Fabric Commission and the Norfolk Historic Environment Record.

And with the following recommendations:

- 1. That if particularly significant discoveries are made during the works, the results should be published in a suitable journal.
- 2. That the Cathedral checks that the additional volume of rainfall entering the public drain as a result of these modifications will be acceptable with the local authority.
