The inspection findings indicate that the school is living up to its foundation as a Church school and is enabling people to flourish.							
The inspection findings indicate that the school has strengths as a Church school but that there are issues that leaders need to address as a matter of priority. These relate to [vision/RE/collective worship] and are listed in the areas for development. (For ease of reference they are listed below.)							
a) School and trust leaders have not ensured that there is a theologically rooted Christian vision for the school that is enabling people to flourish. b) School and trust leaders have not ensured that the curriculum reflects the school's Christian vision. c) School and trust leaders have not ensured that collective worship is enabling pupils and adults to flourish spiritually. d) School and trust leaders have not ensured that pupils and adults are treated well. e) School and trust leaders have not ensured that the school's Christian vision creates an active culture of justice and responsibility. f) School and trust leaders have not ensured that the provision, profile, and priority of religious education result in an effective curriculum. g) In a (former) voluntary aided school, or in a former voluntary controlled school in which denominational religious education is taught, school and trust leaders have not ensured that the quality of teaching is good, and that pupils make at least expected progress.							
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
