As a Church community, we wanted to respond to the climate crisis we face, joining this Diocese in its desire to reach net zero by 2030. We were also aware of the needs locally. The Warm space initiative in Swindon was launched but the Local Authority Buildings, weren't able to help, and libraries even changed sockets so visitors couldn't charge phones or laptops

Warm space initiative, in Swindon, we wanted to serve our community, but how can we make it affordable for us in the long run.



Holy Trinity Shaw was built in the 1980's a massive building with an enormous utility bills but we wanted to be brave, inclusive, hospitable, serving our community. Most importantly as stewards of all that God has given us. We asked could we join the scheme. We got a yes!

Importantly we requested a visit from the DAC. In conversation it became obvious we needed to dream about the future, giving scope for future development. So siting is planned in such a way that if we can fund it affordable accommodation could be built on an additional floor.
