Research Conference 2024



May 29-30 2024 will be our second GF research conference, this time held in partnership with Ripon College, Cuddesdon just outside Oxford – a really beautiful setting. With a bar. We're working hard to make the conference as accessible as possible to people who process learning in all sorts of different ways. Why not form a mini learning community and come along together? Research on Transitions



Sarah Earnshaw and Ali Campbell offer brief headlines from their GF research project in Blackburn Diocese. Reflect on your Y6/Y7s and how they are feeling at this stage of their life.

The "Transitions" project aimed to discover how children in Year 6 and Year 7 felt about the transition from Primary to Secondary school. Workshops were conducted with 285 children and young people. 165 from 5 Primary Schools and 120 from 3 Secondary Schools.

In the workshops, children were encouraged to "be a voice, not an echo" (Albert Einstein). We wanted to make sure we heard from every single child in a way that enabled them to fully participate. We did this by having a variety of workshop activities ranging from group discussion to using buttons to indicate preferences, to blob pictures and jenga blocks!

The data we collected, from photos of activity to 100s of post-it notes is still being collated, but we have received some fascinating reflections from the children. Let me share a couple of those to whet your appetite for the full report.

"Jesus Images" We presented the children with six images of Jesus and asked them, "Which of these most represents Jesus to you?" In one of the Primary Schools the "Bar Code" Jesus was the most popular. When the children were asked why they picked that one, a couple of the children said they had picked it because it was blurry. In their religion (two Muslim children) they said that images

of their prophets couldn't be reproduced - hence their choice. Another child said, "It looks like He has hacked the World - which is what Jesus did."

"Traffic Lights" We used traffic lights to help the children think about what had been helpful in preparing them for Secondary School, Red being "what hasn't helped and needs to stop"; Green being "this is good and helping me"; Amber being "I'm not sure about it, but this is what I'm hoping for". The biggest anxiety revolved around friendships - will I be able to make new ones? I'll miss my old friends! A couple of really poignant thoughts were also expressed, "I don't want to lose my personality"; "I want to bring love and hope to my upcoming secondary school."

There is so much more to share as the workshop also covered their experiences of collective worship, when and where they felt close to God, what they would want to take with them (if they could) when they made the move.




Our friends at the <u>Centre For Chaplaincy In Education</u> (CCE) are seeking new trustees.
