Welcome to the Growing Faith Foundation! Growing Faith is the movement that exists to change the culture of the Church of England so that everyone instinctively puts children and young people at the heart of all we do as a church. The Foundation began in 2022. It built on work that had been developed across the dioceses to encourage churches, schools and households to work together to nurture the spirituality of children and young people.

A Growing Faith approach might be a simple conversation between a church and a local school that says, 'We're your church, how can we help you?' or a diocesan-wide programme that touches the lives of thousands of children, young people and families through the schools in its care. It could be a group of parents who gather to pray in the church for the school community, or a church that welcomes the school's young people to help lead a service.

Growing Faith is more a lens than a project, a way of seeing the opportunities in the local community and joining in with what God is already doing there. Growing Faith prioritises under-16s because we want every person of every age, including the young, to know how much God loves them, how important they are in the family of the church and for them too to have the opportunity to shape and lead the church for today and tomorrow. Simply put, research suggests that if that age group isn't made a priority, they won't find a place or a voice in the local church.

When Jesus wanted his followers to understand what discipleship was all about, he placed a child in the middle of the conversation. The church and indeed the country needs children and young people to be at the centre of our thoughts and plans and hearts – for their sakes and for our own.

Growing Faith goes out to where those children and young people already are and meets them there. It involves making safe spaces where they can be listened to and responded to. It's about creating lasting relationships of trust across the generations, about embracing the rhythms of school, home and church, about joining people of all ages together in a community filled with purpose.

What's important to Growing Faith is that children and young people, their carers and parents, the adults surrounding them in church and in school all help shape the church, flourish within it and work together to grow what Jesus called the kingdom of heaven in every community. So here we hand over to Eden to share why faith – and the Church - is important to her.





"Our school vision is 'Living life in all its fullness' and within my church, my family and my school together, I can experience the Christain faith while still living my life as a teenage girl! School can be a stressful place with tests, homework and just getting through the day. So having my school recognise my faith, and allowing me to express it helps me to grow as a Christian even when things are difficult.

I have always lived in a household that loves and believes in God, and had them support me in this too. This stability has helped me to cherish the little things in life as well as the big things. Ever since I have been little I have attended church, but only recently have I realised the significance and impact that it has had upon my life. Church has taught me to embrace the path that God has laid out for me rather than take the easy route.

If I am not at school then I am spending my time with my family and church family. So having the stability of faith that runs through all three areas of my life allows me to grow in faith, and live my life in all of its fullness."

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growing faith Hubs



Growing Faith Learning Hubs are centres of innovation, where schools/churches are resourced to further embed creative practices that build the strategic partnership between school, church and home. Hubs are creative spaces where people are encouraged to try imaginative approaches as we seek to double the number of children and young active disciples in the Church of England by 2030. The Learning Hubs are funded with an annual grant.

The Foundation has funded 18 Hubs across the country, some supported by external funders. The Hubs launched throughout 2023 and early 2024.
