## 1. Why we collect and use your personal data

CEFEL's various programmes bring leaders together to support and inspire each other and the data we collect is used to facilitate these programmes, including registration, programme participation, and associated events.

# 3. Who we share your information with:

We will not share your personal data with any other third parties except where specified here.

- FormAssembly third-party data processor for capturing form responses.
- Brevo (formerly Send in Blue third-party data processor for sending out marketing emails including newsletters.
- Some programmes will involve a mentorship opportunity (e.g. Leaders Like Us), and so your name and contact information will be provided to your assigned mentor.
- Some programmes have a dedicated group chat facilitated by the CEFEL team. These group chats are hosted on the WhatsApp messaging platform, and WhatsApp collects users personal information including name and phone numbers. If you consent to joining the group chat, your name and phone number will be visible to other chat participants.
- The Difference Programme is jointly facilitated with the Reconciling Leaders Network (part of the Archbishop of Canterbury's Reconciliation Ministry). Personal data of potential and confirmed programme participants collected by the CEFEL team are shared with RLN to facilitate programme attendance and engagement.

#### 4. Your personal data will not be sent to countries outside the UK/EEA.

Your personal data will be retained on systems that are held within the UK/EEA that are compliant with the current UK/EU GDPR requirements.

## 5. How long do we keep your information?

We will keep your data for 1 year after your programme participation concludes.

## 6. Your rights

You have the following rights regarding your personal data:

- The right to be informed about any data we hold about you;
- The right to request a copy of your personal data which we hold about you;
- The right to withdraw your consent at any time (if applicable);
- The right to request that we correct any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date;
- The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for us to retain such data;
- The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing;
- The right to object to the processing of your personal data (if applicable).
