

VALUING ALL GOD'S CHILDREN?

Join us as we explore the impact of the Church of England's guidance for schools, *Valuing All God's Children*, in the courtroom and the classroom. We will consider how it has shaped pastoral responses and been used vis-à-vis Christians.

SPEAKERS

Nigel & Sally Rowe

Well known nationally for their Judicial Review (JR) challenging the government's approach to gender questioning children, Nigel and Sally will tell the story of how they and their sons were branded "transphobic" by their Church of England school for raising concerns over a boy in their 6-year-old son's class who would sometimes present as a girl. The JR directly led to the government reviewing, and now publishing, the draft guidance for schools.



Calvin and his wife, Nicola, challenged their children's Church of England primary school for secretly teaching extreme trans ideology without informing parents. Following several complaints, the school appealed to Valuing All God's Children to justify the approach.

Tim Dieppe

Tim is Head of Public Policy at Christian Concern. He led Christian Concern's response to the consultation on gender questioning children in schools. Tim frequently represents a Christian perspective in the media.


Spot the Difference


