A Hub Update



We're coming to you this week with an update from our Chatting Faith project, based jointly in the dioceses of Winchester and Portsmouth.

Chatting Faith is all about 'normalising the spiritual,' encouraging families to have relaxed, natural conversations about faith, using secular children's books as a starting point. Watch their <u>video report</u> to find out more.

Research Report



Karen Beal offers a few brief thoughts from her research project in Manchester Diocese

The 'Are we listening?' research project aimed to investigate how children's voices contribute to various aspects of church land school life particularly in the area of worship.

Three churches and two schools took part in the mixed method research – we had a graffiti table, made modelling dough and Lego models and posters too. We had lots of conversation about if and how participants are able to take part in planning and leading worship and whether they are involved in the decision making process at church and school.

Here are just a few quotes:

About being involved in planning and leading worship;

- 'We don't normally get to make decisions about what we do...about what we are going to do'
- 'We would like to make suggestions because I think that sometimes like...something like at Christmas...like we could plan something'
- 'What they could do is tell children what they need to talk about in the lines, but then let the children write the lines....Like cos a lot of time when you read it, it's like you're reading like a book out to them and not what you feel and thought and how you would talk'

How could adults listen better to people their age?

- Not acting towards you like you're a child...like giving them ideas...making space where you can suggest things
- Have a like a school council but at church so you could have your say on like services
- Listen to what we are saying...by actually talking to us

It's been an absolute joy to undertake this incredibly thought provoking piece of research as I had the privilege of speaking with and listening to the participants. I look forward to sharing my findings with you soon.
