Representative to the Synod of the Moravian Church, 18-22 July 2024

The Chair of the Provincial Board of the Moravian Church in Britain has invited the Church of England to send a representative to its annual Synod, which will meet at the Hayes Christian Conference Centre, Swanwick, Derbyshire, from Thursday 18 to Monday 22 July 2024. Further details will be given in due course. Accommodation, travel and other costs will be covered by the Church of England.

The Moravian Church, formally the Unitas Fratrum ('unity of the brethren'), traces its origins back to the fifteenth century in Bohemia. It is one of the oldest Protestant denominations in the world. In the eighteenth century it was part of the Evangelical Revival, and had a profound influence on, amongst others, the Wesley brothers. In 1995, under the Fetter Lane Agreement, the Church of England recognised a very close working relationship with the Moravian Church, based on substantial theological agreement.
