## 1. Why we collect and use your personal data

Personal information is collected for the following purpose/s:

### Consent

Any dietary or accessibility requirements provided will be recorded to arrange suitable catering options and assist in making the event accessible.

You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time by contacting the email address provided in Section 8 below. If you withdraw your consent, you will no longer be included in our attendee list, and all personal details will be removed. No data will be shared externally.

#### **4. Your personal data will not be sent to countries outside the UK.**

#### **5. How long do we keep your information?**

We will keep your information for three months after the conference, and personal details will be removed in January 2025.

#### **6. Your rights**

You have the following rights regarding your personal data:

- The right to be informed about any data we hold about you;
- The right to request a copy of your personal data which we hold about you;
- The right to withdraw your consent at any time (if applicable);
- The right to request that we correct any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date;
- The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for us to retain such data;
- The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing;
- The right to object to the processing of your personal data (if applicable);
- The right to obtain and reuse your personal data to move, copy or transfer it from one IT system to another (if applicable).
